LAND RUN 2022 SASS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

Mae (SASS #80828) and Matt Black (SASS #54580) as not only the 2022 SASS National Champions, but also overall winners, Land Run, the 2022 SASS National Championship ended.

The awards banquet, with more than 800 attending, was without a doubt at the best Cowboy banquet facility in America, The National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum.

But the banquet was only one part of the match, which began Tuesday October 11 with warm up matches held throughout the day on all twelve bays. Probably because this was the first time many shooters attended Land Run, we had considerably more shooters participate in warm up matches than we anticipated, with more than 500.

With the National Championship being held in the central United States, we weren't sure how attendance would be affected. Forty-five states and three foreign countries were represented. We were pleased so many shooters who have perhaps not attended because of travel distance were able to attend. The top three states represented were Texas — 165, Oklahoma — 95, and Kansas — 34. Arkansas, Illinois, and Missouri tied for fourth with 30 each. Obviously,

moving the national championship to the middle of the U.S. worked.

Wednesday did not disappoint. The swap meet had gotten so big it had to be held in two spaces. The saloon and the pavilion were filled with folks selling what they no longer needed and those looking for a bargain.

Side matches and additional warm up matches were held on Wednesday and a first ever for Land Run, The Plainsman mini match. Thank you, Chili Pepper Pete (SASS #11917), for running this match for us. Shooters seemed to appreciate that the side matches were included in their match

fee, as a large number participated.

Three days of main match shooting with 36 posses caused a little anxiety for the Oklahoma Territorial Marshals and the Deputies, as we had never shot three flights in one day. We hoped we'd have time to check and double check scores before the Saturday Night banquet and awards ceremony. But it was worry for naught, thanks to well-written stages and efficient posse marshals. We managed to stay on schedule every flight and every day.

We have had many requests from shooters who were unable to attend for the stages, so we have included them in this article along with photos of the bays where they were shot.

The evening events seemed to be well received. Starting off with Wednesday evening being a "come and go" reception and meet and greet at The National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum. The more than 350 shooters attending had a chance to leisurely tour the fantastic exhibits of the museum and perhaps have a few drinks. They also had a chance to learn some new dance steps, thanks to Miss Tabitha (SASS #26972). Hopefully, those who attended enjoyed this more than a traditional opening ceremony. We also have something special planned for you next year.

With so many shooters from out of town, we decided to leave Thursday evening open to allow them to visit the many fine restaurants in Edmond and Oklahoma City and maybe even visit our Stockyards District and check out one of our match sponsors, McClintock's Tavern & Restaurant. Fortunately, we finished in time and now it was time to award winners for


a record number of 62 categories. We also got to recognize side match winners, Plainsman winners, and 109 clean match awards. That's right, we had 109 shooters who kept it together for twelve stages over three days without a miss. Congratulations to them all.

The costume contest, which had better participation than we have ever had, was conducted before dinner and thanks to our panel of judges Shotglass (SASS #17153), Aspen Filly (SASS #50535), and Cowtown Scout (SASS #53540), we awarded three places for each costume contest category.



CONDUCTING A "GREAT" COSTUME CONTEST SUGGESTIONS FOR THE COSTUME CONTEST CHAIRPERSON

a SASS Costume Contest utilizing the SASS Costume Contest Management and Administration Handbook" as part of the match, per the contract with SASS. All annual matches are encouraged to hold a costume contest.

Costume contests should be well planned and not an afterthought, and the "SASS Costume Contest Management and Administration" helps do this by covering contest organization, chairperson's duties, structuring the contest, categories, judging criteria and judges, and mechanics. It also contains fillable forms necessary for a costume contest. The forms can be printed from the website or downloaded and filled in when they are needed. The handbook and

forms will be especially helpful to new Costume Contest Chairpersons. What works best often depends on the size of the match/event, facilities available, and the budget. But when all Costume Contest Chairpersons follow these guidelines and use the same forms, contestants will know how to prepare for the costume contest and understand the scoring criteria. The costume handbook is on the SASS website (sassnet.com), on the home page. Click on Handbooks, then under CAS Match Directors Handbooks, click on Costume Admin.

The Costume Contest Chairperson is appointed by the Match Director. The chairperson works with the Match Director to plan for the costume contests. The chairperson should publish an information flyer and if needed, an entry form that will be provided to all match participants. It should contain everything a contestant would need to know about the contest. It should explain what contests will be held — *e.g.* Shooting, Wild Bunch, and Best Dressed, when, where, and how the contests will be conducted, what categories will be offered, and

who is eligible to enter. If the club has a website, this information should be published with other match information on the website.

One of the most important decisions a costume chairperson must make is who to invite to be a costume judge. Most matches should have at least three judges and up to five. Do not pick judges "on the fly." When deciding who to invite to be a judge, not only look within your club, but also look at the people who have signed up to attend the match. Look for names of people who have won one or more costume contests or been a judge at another match. These people have the experience and knowledge of what makes a great costume and may be willing to be a judge for your match. All judges should review the Costume Admin Handbook and the CAS Shooters Handbook for the shooting costume category requirements.

Judging criteria is also important. As already pointed out, there are judging forms ready for use in the Costume Admin Handbook. These judging forms were revised in 2016 to reflect appropriate categories to be judged. Presentation is now used only to break a tie. You will notice on one of the judging examples how the presentation might be used to break a tie. It is a good idea to assign numbers to contestants for judging at a big match. It saves time and is more efficient. There is a contestant signin list using numbers in the Costume Admin Handbook, but not included is a new sign-in form I recently started using and sharing with other costume contest chairpersons. It is a simple half-page form the contestant fills out and takes to the judges' table. The head judge enters a number in the box for the contestant at the top left corner of the sign in form (numerical order—it does not matter what category they enter). Once winners have been determined, just pull the corresponding number on the sign in form and you have all the information needed for completion of awards (see example). Also included is an example of the 2022 EOT Entry Form/Information Page. They use the box in the upper left corner to assign a number to the contestant but also record the contestant name and number on a master sign-in list like the one in the handbook. (Thanks to The Arizona Territorial Company of Rough Riders for allowing me use their form as an example.) Several scoring sheets using contestants' aliases are also in the Costume Admin Handbook if you choose to not use numbers. I put judging sheets for each judge in a ring binder with dividers

to separate the categories. It makes for easy access to category sheets as each contestant comes to the judges' table.

If you publish an article in *The Cowboy Chronicle* about the match, please include information and pictures of costume winners!



ou always read glowing reports of matches done well. They always start with wow or amazing or some other great word to sum it all up and show the writer's enthusiasm for the match they attended or built. The match director at this match was Hondo Tweed (SASS #99043) with his army of Rough Riders helping and supporting everything that needed doing to put on a Wild Bunch match of this size and scope. Hondo knows how to produce a great match! His abilities to cover all aspects are substantial. Everything at a great match is in the details. Scheduling is everything! To look into the future and try to imagine posse speeds and capabilities is part fortune teller and part magician. The rabbit got pulled out of the hat on this one! Sometimes all the side noise makes for lost sight of goals. Not this match! Everything revolved around the competitors having a great match. The Nationals had right at 100 competitors shooting Wild Bunch and that was the limit. The match in essence sold out. Everything at this match ran on time. Everything. That takes planning! Elwood James (SASS#99238) was the range officer for this match and in addition to being a great ambassador for WB he wore so many hats that a stand alone article could be written on this man. Not only will he step up to the plate, he will hit a home run for you.

So first thought of a great match is you have to have great stages. They didn't have a couple and then fillers. They had 10 great, well-thought-out stages. They were a varied mix that featured plenty of pistol work in a target rich environment. All the targets were hittable without difficulty but the shooter needed to know where his front sight was. Sweeps were a proven mix with Nevada sweeps, double/triple tap combinations, and of course the

famous (infamous?) Oklahoma two-step that's easier to shoot than explain. A fully loaded pump Winchester shotgun is a sight to behold and a force to be reckoned with. It was used plenty along with the major pistol caliber lever actions.

When you have a lot of folks together who really like to shoot the question to ask is, "what to do after the match each day? Side matches would be the answer, with a hearty shout. And side matches they had. These can't be listed in order of greatness because every one of them was stellar. Jungle Run the name kinda gives an idea of the possibility of adventure. It begins with a fully loaded shotgun, a trail through the woods, and a belt full of shells. Shooter engages a Spinning Texas Star loaded with clay birds then rapidly advances along the trail, shooting clays mounted on steel posts. Jungle Run was used as a SASS Scholarship fundraiser — \$10 was charged and it could be shot over again for another 10 bucks. This great and fun side match, along with a supper for donations and an impromptu auction for bullets, raised a total of \$1340, which was presented to Misty Moonshine at the Wild Bunch banquet. Wild Bunch side matches are well supported by the shooters and I won't describe each one, but each is unique and fun. BAMM, Teddy Roosevelt, Doughboy, Wild Bunch clays, fastest rifle/pistol/shotgun, and Top Shot (a memorial match dedicated to honor Goatneck Clem).

The 10 stages were banked and it was too early for dinner, so what do you think we did? We had a top gun shoot off. It should have been televised. TEDDY ROOSEVELT

WILD BUNCH ACTION SHOOTING INTRODUCES THE TEDDY ROOSEVELT SIDE MATCH

the 1895 Winchester to great effect charging San Juan Hill. In the southwest, where the Arizona Rangers' lives depended on good equipment and engagement distance could be long, the rangers adopted the '95 Winchester.

Pancho Villa's Dorados were well mounted and well armed. They wore crossed bandoliers of gleaming cartridges and each man carried his pride and joy, the *treinte treinte* — the Winchester 1894 in .30-30, which is so popular at

the time it was immortalized in song. In Texas, the Rangers have adopted the '94 and '95 Winchesters, and so have sheriffs, city police forces, ranchers, and bad actors. What does all the above have in common? They all acquired the most advanced rifles for the time. Rifles that could project power and accuracy over great distances. This was a big advantage in wide open. Looking at photographs of this era it is clear that rifle caliber rifles were popular and abundant.

INTRODUCING WILD BUNCH ACTION SHOOTING NEWEST OFFICIAL SIDE MATCH — TEDDY ROOSEVELT

What is it? How do you do it? What types of guns are legal? Is it fun? First off, absolutely yes it is fun! It opens up a lot of great guns that get to be used in this category. The shotguns and pis-

tols are the same as normal Wild Bunch. The variance is with the rifles. The Wild Bunch powers that be understand there were many different types of firearms being used during the time period we portray.

The rifle must be chambered in a rifle caliber. To get the ball rolling, think 1894 Winchester .30-30. This is a rifle everyone has — and if you don't it's time to buy one. These old rifles are versatile, great on horseback, four wheeler, Jeep, truck, and now legal to shoot in competition. So, it's a great gun but what else. Okay, 1876, 1886, 1894, 1895 Winchesters are all legal. The Savage 1895 and '99 are legal. The Remington model 14/141 are slick little pump rifles and yes, they are legal. The Marlin 1893 and 1895 are legal but the 336 is not. All the above are legal with barrel, tang, or receiver sights. That's right, a receiver sight is period correct for the time frame portrayed, so they are legal for Teddy Roosevelt. The Remington 14/141 are nicely-built rifles in calibers .25, .30, .32, and .35 Remington. The first three are close ballisticly to the .25-35, .30-30, and .32 Winchester Special. I guess it could be argued the .33 Winchester chambered in the 1886 is close to the .35 Remington. Anyway the model 14/141 is a trim, handy little rifle with good balance. One of its selling points was the fact that through a specially-designed tubular magazine, Spitzer-style bullets could safely be used. Although the magazine holds but four cartridges, a fifth cartridge can be added

during a stage.

Photographic evidence shows the Savage 99/95 in use during our time frame. They are chambered in a multitude of cartridges, perhaps the most famous being the .300 savage. From the factory these are well-made rifles that are accurate, well balanced, and really way ahead of their time. They use a rotary magazine built into the gun that has a brass indicator to tell you how many rounds you have left. To load, the bolt is levered open and the rounds are dropped in from the top, much like a bolt action. These rifles also feature cocking indicators. The .300 savage was looked at by the military and they liked a lot of what they saw. With the addition of a longer neck and a few other tweaks a new cartridge emerged from it — the 7.62x51, also known in civilian circles as the .308 Winchester.

Whichever rifle you choose would be great for TR. Personal choice or what you have already would be the deciding factor, because whatever is chosen, lead bullets must be used along with reduced velocity. The bullets can be gas checked. It seems most of these old rifles are partial to the original weight of factory-loaded bullets. So the .30-30 and most other .30 caliber appears to favor 150- to 180-grain bullets. Good results have been had with heavier bullets (190-200 grain) in .30/40 Krag and .303 British. Lots of different powders that are probably in most reloaders' possession right now will reach the reduced velocity. These include 2400, RL7, and 4759 as a few examples. The sweet spot is around 1500 fps, which still shoots plenty flat but lessens the recoil considerably. Most all distances shot are 40 to 80 yards with various sized targets. Handloads for this type of distance are easy to assemble for good accuracy — 100 yards for a good rifle with reduced power ammunition is not far. A tip for farther out — just because a load shoots accurately at 100 yards does not instantly mean it's accurate at 200 to 300 yards or farther. The only way to know is to actually shoot that particular load at that distance. The match director balances the size and distance of the targets to enable the competitors to shoot the rifle targets with speed and accuracy usually a five-shot string, but always be prepared for a higher round count on

the clock. Your local match director has the latitude to use Teddy Roosevelt as a category at your local match. Imagine the fun! AR500 targets are the gold standard for Teddy Roosevelt, Doughboy, BAMM etc. Where damage occurs at close range with mild steel, zero damage occurs with AR500. Highly recommend!

Teddy Roosevelt opens a door to many old guns that languish in closets around the country. Many times a good cleaning and proper oiling brings the old gun to order. Reduced loads are gentle to these guns. Teddy Roosevelt gives the perfect excuse to reconnect with these warriors of the past. It's time to get that rifle off the fireplace mantle and enter a Teddy Roosevelt match. TR is new but is growing in popularity. Don't have it yet? Talk to your match director, get a few shooters together and start shooting! I'm Dusty Boddams and that's the Boddam line.

rere's some advice for young, vibrant shooters. If you want to get good at something you have to practice. Olympic athletes, major league baseball, basketball, football, hockey players, etc., all got where they are by practicing. If you're just shooting two to four matches a month and not practicing in between matches you're as good as you're going to be. You are simply maintaining a level of proficiency. If you want to grow better you have to practice.

Now, does this apply to us older shooters? No. We have to practice to keep from getting worse! It's true. Things like deteriorating vision, arthritis, diminished cognitive faculties, failing hand/eye coordination, etc. are all working against the aging shooter.

If I dry fire six stages at home I average about three really good, smooth and efficient performances. The other three will invariably feature some kind of glitch (this applies to matches too). I'll bobble a shotgun load, lever my rifle twice and only pull the trigger once (which would cause a jacked out round) or fumble getting my revolver back in its holster. I've shot this sport for more than twenty years and I'm still practicing about thirty minutes a day, five and six days a week! You'd think I would have all these things perfected by now. Nope. I'm actually losing ability. Practice, however is slowing this loss down. But here's the best part. It's giving me hope. You see, every now and then... not very often mind you but once in a blue moon I'll get through six stages in a practice session with NO GLITCH-ES! This gives birth to the hope that I might just be able to put together a clean, smooth, efficient match one of these days. Like six perfect stages! It hasn't happened lately but you know... I feel like it could. Hope is a beautiful thing.

PRACTICE

I don't practice as much as I should — certainly not every day or even every week — but when I do practice I do notice my scores improving. Once upon a time, when I did practice two or three times a week, I was almost pretty good.

Practice is important, but I want to point out the practice must be "good" and "appropriate" practice. If you just set up some tin cans and plink at them, that's not practice. Set up an actual course of fire — you can use paper plates taped to the living room wall and dry fire at them — and shoot that course of fire seriously.

The great Vince Lombardi once said, "Practice doesn't make perfect. Only perfect practice makes perfect." This philosophy is taken to heart by renowned Cowboy Action Shooter[™] and shooting coach Pecos Clyde (SASS #48481) and he makes sure to drum it into his students... including multiple National and World Champion SASS Kicker (SASS #91899).

I've been lamenting of late about the passing of so many of our cherished friends in Cowboy Action Shooting™ and I regret to say some of them strike close to home. Both Yuma Jack (SASS #8960) and Devil's Bliss (SASS #57645), whose obituaries appear herein, were good friends of mine and I will miss them.

TEJAS CABALLEROS HOSTS 2022 COPS & COWBOYS COMPETITION

lanco, Texas. Saturday, October 29, 2022, the Texas Legacy Foundation held an Annual Cops & Cowboys Shootout at the Tejas Caballeros shooting range. The match took place at an Old West Town on Ranch Road 1623 seven miles west of Blanco deep in the Hill Country. Cowboys shot Old West revolvers, Cowboy shotguns, and lever rifles, while officers shot modern semi-auto service weapons. The Cops & Cowboys compete by shooting metal targets located outside Old West buildings that include a Saloon, a Bank, a Gallows, a Livery, and a Jail, to name a few.

So who is the fastest? Old West Guns or Modern Weapons? Cops or Cowboys? The Cops won this year, but not by as

much as you might think. An engraved plaque that records the history of this event was taken home by the Cops. In the last four years, the Cops have won three times and the Cowboys have won once. Maybe the Cowboys will win next year? The event is open to the public and it is a blast to watch! The Old West Town, known as Determination, was built by the Tejas Caballeros Cowboy Shooting Club.

For the third year running, the top lawman was Patrol Captain Steven Clark of the Burnet County Sheriff's Department. The top cowboy was Alamo Andy (SASS #101775) of San Antonio. While there was a commanding space of 17 seconds between the shooting times of Capt. Clark and Alamo Andy, the overall time difference between the Cops team and the Cowboys team was a mere 2.26 seconds in the final competition.

Team selections were handled differ-

ently for this fourth annual competition. Seeking to make the event more inclusive of all shooters. Five-person teams were selected by the top lawman and the top Cowboy from the listing of all top shooters. Following selection, the lawmen team was comprised of three lawmen and two Cowboys. Similarly the Cowboy team was comprised of three Cowboys and two lawmen.

All participants of both teams provided an amazing display of speed and accuracy. The Cowboy team was leading by 6.38 seconds until an unfortunate procedural error charged them with a ten-second penalty. The penalty wiped out the Cowboy lead and left the team in second place, 2.26 seconds behind the Cops team.

Aside from the fun and fellowship among shooters, the purpose of the Cops & Cowboys Shootout is the raising of funds for the Hill Country 100 Club. The Hill Country 100 Club is a great volunteer organization that gives \$25,000 to the family of first responders killed in the line of duty within 24 to 48 hours, along with other financial aid as needed (HC100Club.com). Donations from area citizens and businesses have accounted for donations exceeding \$14,000 in the four-year history of the event.



afternoon match on Saturday as well. Main matches ran Saturday and Sunday.


























VIRGINIA STATE CHAMPIONSHIP GUNFIGHT AT THE DOUBLE C 2022



shooting sports. Cavalier is centrally located and easily accessible via I-95 to I-64 West, approximately 20 miles West of Richmond, VA in western Hanover County. The Cavalier Cowboys, led by Major B. S. Walker (SASS #88184 Regulator), began planning for hosting the match nearly a year ago, after it was moved from the previous hosts at Bend Of Trail near Roanoke, Virginia. The match objective, above all else, was FUN! "Big and Close and on the East Coast" became our motto.

Fortunate to have five separate shooting bays, the 10-stage championship moved along smoothly with five posses shooting two stages per bay-six stages on Saturday and four stages Sunday. The terrain is mostly flat with a gentle slope (about a six-foot elevation change) over the 400 yards between Bay 1 and Bay 5. All the shooting bays are enclosed in berms with no need for a common firing line. Dozens of campers began arriving on Thursday and continued into Friday. They enjoyed wooded lakeside campsites and comfortable surroundings. Amenities included a bathhouse with Cowgirl and Cowboy toilets and showers, potable water, and even some power, though many ran generators all weekend. Side matches and the Two Stage Bash (warm up stages) were held on Friday. The Main Match kicked off Saturday morning. The weather was sunny and warm but multiple fans, tents, and canopies had been placed at every stage, and these were much appreciated throughout the weekend. A great Cowboy feast was catered Saturday after the stages (about 2:00 p.m.) under a big pavilion near the campsites. Afterwards, competitors retired to their campsites or

DISPATCHES FROM CAMP BAYLOR, JANUARY 2023 STANDARD MANUFACTURING COMPANY SINGLE ACTION REVOLVER

tandard Manufacturing was founded in 2011 as the firearms design and manufacturing subsidiary of the Connecticut Shotgun Manufacturing Company, a manufacturer, repairer, and distributor of shotguns and related products.

I had never handled a Standard Manufacturing Single Action. They make virtually flawless replicas of prewar SAAs. I knew everyone who had one raved about them, Michael Bane being the most vocal. You get what you pay for. There is nothing cheap on them, and they are not cheap.

Then *The Cowboy Chronicle* editor Skinny asked if I wanted to do a test on one. Imagine the response of a soldier returning from war asked if he wanted a date with a Playboy Playmate.

Having no shame, I asked for two so I could shoot them in a match, and 4-3/4" barrels because that is the most

popular length in SASS competition. (They are available in 4-3/4", 5-1/2", and 7-1/2".) They said yes (twin Playboy Playmates).

When I picked them up at a friendly FFL and opened the box I was surprised. I had seen only Color Case Hardening and bluing. They're both nickel plated, a \$100 option over bone CCH and bluing. The nickel plating looks perfect.

Among the paperwork in each box was a card. "This gun has been thoroughly inspected before packaging in our

facility. We guarantee that this gun left here in perfect condition, no blemishes or scratches whatever. Be sure if gun shop opens this gun, it is done with the most care. This gun left our facility with no imperfections."

I thought, "That's pretty strong." I also thought, "and I'm going to holster them, draw them, and shoot them as much as I can before they have to be returned." I wasn't concerned about any handling damage. They were designed and built to shoot.

Standard's description of the gun: "To start, this entire gun is made of solid 4140 steel; there are no inferior cast or metal injection molded parts used. No other maker of this type of gun can make such a claim. Additionally, the precision machining equipment used in the manufacture of our guns is the absolute finest in the industry and because the machining is done in-house, quality is carefully controlled. Even the very best parts are of little value without the hands and minds of experienced gunsmiths. The master gunsmiths here at Standard Manufacturing are versed in making iconic guns that include the Ansley H. Fox, Parker, and Model 21 double shotguns."

Common knowledge is the assumption they have the US Firearms Co. machinery after they closed. Common knowledge is wrong. Lou Frutuoso of parent company Connecticut Firearms is quoted as saying, "Our guns are made on

better machinery and use better materials than [USFA] used."

Note the pointed firing pin on the hammer. The gun clicks four times when you cock it slowly. The action is pure 1873 SAA. There is no transfer bar, no retractable firing pin, no two-position base pin, and no key-operated safety in

the action. The springs are like original 1873 SAAs, flat, no coil mainspring or hammer spring. This is a replica. You are solely responsible for operating it safely. If you want it just like it was in the Old West, this is it. Wyatt Earp, sitting at a poker game, suffered the indignity of having his '73 go bang when it fell out of his coat, damaging his wardrobe but missing parts that bleed. Load five for poker games and SASS. Load six when walking to the OK Corral.

I will also note that when you cock the hammer or rotate the cylinder, clicks have a distinct music to them, like Colt's. It's a sound that evokes all the legend and lore of the Single Action Armies.

They sent consecutive serial numbers (Identical twin Playboy Playmates!).

These have two-piece walnut grips. They're serial numbered, too. They fit so well on the grips I'm guessing they're made like original Colt's, the rough grips are mounted on the rough grip frame and the grips get shaped along with the grip frame. They are the best fitting grips I've ever used. Yes, they feel great and evoke more lore and legend. Options for grips are One-piece Fancy Wood \$150, Checkered \$350, Tru-Ivory \$400. (Not



elephant ivory.)

Note the Standard Manufacturing paperwork list the caliber as .45 Long Colt. I know this will stun those guys who scare off beginners on Faceplant or the SASS Wire for saying .45 Long Colt instead of .45 Colt.

The only caliber they make is .45

Long Colt. I would suggest at least a test run of .38/.357s. Sixty to seventy-five percent of SASS shooters shoot .38 Special. We know this from brass picked up at lost brass matches like EOT.

Like original Colts, everything is serial numbered, the frame, the grip frame, the cylinder, grips, etc. And everything fits. The grips fit tightly. "Even all of the screws are perfectly timed from north to south." Normally I do some disassembly to photograph interior parts. But I wasn't going to mess with that perfection. So, I asked for photos of the hand and bolt. They sent several parts photos.

Trigger pull: serial number 2051 averaged 2 lb. 15.4 oz. in 10 pulls on my Wheeler Engineering electronic trigger pull gauge, and number 2052 averaged 2 lb. 15.3 oz. Crisp. Impressed yet? I am. Three or so is usually the lowest a company will put on the open market for liability reasons. I would be happy with these guns out of the box. The internal parts have been polished and honed, and the timing is perfect. With the all-steel moving parts I would expect these guns to withstand years of CAS abuse without needing a gunsmith. But you would eventually need to take them apart to clean and lining up those screws would be on you. Two words — Gunsmith screwdrivers.

"Wait! Are you suggesting using these guns in SASS competition, what you call CAS abuse? They're too pretty for that!" Yes. They're designed and built to be rode hard and put away wet. Most people will shoot them a little and keep them in the gun safe a lot. SASS competitors USE their guns.

I wanted to shoot them in a match,

but the deadline and Land Run conspired and left me only a smidgen of time to shoot them. So, A.D. (SASS #16339 Life) and I went to Determination, Texas, a neat SASS-oriented facility on a ranch near Blanco, Texas and shot the guns, checking accuracy (better than my abilities, but I did get some cloverleaf groups), point of aim (right on with my Wild Bunch ammunition with 200-grain bullets at 788 ft./sec. (5.5 grains Trail Boss. Power factor 157.8 from the 4-3/4" Colt barrel, 800 ft/sec. PF 160 from my 19" rifle barrel).

The hottest load was 23-year-old Winchester Cowboy ammunition (250grain bullet, 694 ft/sec. PF 173,5). I started with ammunition like that and even more powerful. Commercial Cowboy Ammunition has changed. I tested some Choice ammunition from a test a few years ago. Their 180-grain load at 462 ft./sec, PF 83 allowed the fastest second shots. Good Classic Cowboy load. Not having any real black powder loads made up or the time to make them, the shooting photos used .45 CS loads with full charge APP FFFg and 155-grain Coated Semi-Wadcutters from Missouri

Bullet Co. I have them to practice with the Ruger Old Armies using conversion cylinders.

I shot them while A.D. used my Nikon D750 with six frames per second to catch every aspect of a shot from hammer fall to re-cocking, over 360 frames to get a couple of photos for the article. Thanks, A. D.

Did I find anything wrong with the guns? No.

Were they fun, accurate, and easy to shoot? Yes.



DISPATCHES FROM CAMP BAYLOR — BONUS NEW GUNFIGHTER GRIPS WITH REACTIVE CHECKERING FROM EAGLE GRIPS


t Land Run five-time World Champion Matt Black (SASS #54580) talked with Eagle Grips President Raj Singh. Matt has been using checkered Eagle Gunfighter grips for 12 years.

Quick history — about 30 years ago Raj Singh and Joe Bowman invented Gunfighter grips for Rugers. They are thinner than regular grips but have a large bulge to keep your hand from riding up on recoil. They have become extremely popular in SASS. After talking with Matt and feeling inspired, Raj did a redesign of the grips that Joe wanted, but production wasn't up to it. Modern machinery is. The changes allow an improved grip. The transition to the front bulge is a different shape, more efficient.

But in addition to that, they have REACTIVE CHECK-ERING (see close up). This just locks your hand in place. It's comfortable and won't make your hands sore like aggressive checkering. The extra checkering on the bulge where your thumb goes adds stability. They also won't stick to or damage your coat if you use them on your carry gun. The harder you grip the tighter they hold. This might sound too good to be true. I'm not going to try to sell them to you. I think you need to try them to believe it. I suggested to Raj all he needs is have a pair on a gun at EOT and Land Run and let people pick it up to spread the word.

The photographs are of one of the prototype pairs. They're Antique Pearl Kirinite. All Kirinite colors, including ivory (for Patton fans) will be available. I've written about Kirinite

in the past. It is a machinable, hard material that has several advantages for gun grips. For one thing, the diamonds on the surface will still be diamonds with sharp corners for years. Sharp diamonds on wood tend to dull after years of use. These won't. Reactive checkering will also be available on 1911 and Colt Python grips, Eaglegrips.com • Call Toll Free: 800-323-6144

BLACK POWDER 101 — PART 4 HOW TO LOAD FOR LONG RANGE RIFLE

Pee Haw! Now you're shooting Cowboy matches and making smoke with the best of them. You just never knew how much fun it is to hear the big rolling BOOM and make a fog bank. Where is that dang target? I know it's out there somewhere! And your spouse has become sorta used to you coming home speckled with soot (why do you think we wear so much black clothing?) and smelling of sulfur and charcoal. But surely there is even more fun to be had with black powder? You're darn tootin' there is — long range rifle! This is where you can really test your skill hitting those targets, out to 1,000-plus yards in some competitions. And once you get into long range shooting with Sharps, High Walls, Rolling Blocks, etc., you'll sneer at the little weenies that need scope sighted rifles to hit anything at a mere 100 yards!

Okay, so here's where we get into the college level black powder loading courses. But don't worry, it ain't rocket science and even Aggies can do it. Heck, I are one — and I ain't blowed myself up yet! So let's get started...

Accompanying this article are photos of a very few of the rifle cartridges available back at the peak of the black powder era. If you want a shoulder mounted (and bruising) howitzer, the .50-140 is your choice! Just think of a 600-plus grain bullet over 140 grains of black powder. I've fired one and I'll pass unless I'm trying to take down King Kong. More realistically, the majority of long range shooters use cartridges between the .38-55 and the .45-90, with by far the most popular being the .45-70. Which cartridge you choose depends, of course, on the type of shooting you intend to do. If you want to try a regulation NRA black powder silhouette match you need a cartridge that will topple the life-sized Ram silhouette (and I don't mean my pickup!) at 500 meters. The strong consensus here is the .40-65 Winchester is the smallest of the group that will reliably

do that. If all you want to do is shoot a "gong" match (such as many clubs do), then any cartridge that will reach out to 500 or 600 yards will work — all you have to do is hit the target. In that case, the .38-55, or even the .32-40, would work and are very mild cartridges with low recoil. By far the most common cartridges are the .40-65 and .45-70. Either will do both types of matches well and brass is easily available through Starline.

A close third in popularity is the .38-55 for gong matches. It's easily available (brass from Starline) and chambered in both Winchester (lever and High Wall) and Marlin (lever) rifles.

Now, when we say "long range" we are generically referring to rifle caliber cartridges. Many clubs offer a class for lever rifles that goes out to typically 300 yards, while the single shots will go to 500 or 600 yards. Loading for the two



types of rifles is considerably different, so we'll address them separately.

SINGLE SHOT BLACK POWDER RIFLE LOADING

While there were (and are) other brands/types of single shot rifles available, the most common in the period, and still today, are the Sharps (who hasn't heard of these legendary rifles?), the Winchester High Wall, and the Remington Rolling Block.

All of these rifles have their advantages and disadvantages, but each of them will drill tiny groups with the proper ammunition. All are currently being manufactured and are easily available. Configurations range from lightweight sporter versions to heavy target versions. For typical long range competition, the heavier rifles and long/heavy barrels are normally preferred, as they better absorb recoil and the barrel is stiffer, both of which contribute to long range accuracy. You'll normally see these rifles weighing 10 to 12 pounds with barrels 28 to 30 inches long.

And now here's my plug for "Buy American." There are two great American companies located in Big Timber, Montana — C. Sharps Arms and Shiloh Rifle Company. At either, you can have built beautiful 1874 Sharps, 1875 Sharps, 1877 Sharps, and High Walls.

And the prices are pretty competitive with the Italian reproductions, with much better quality in my biased opinion. The companies are literally located across the street from one another.

Okay, so how do you go about loading for long range rifles with black powder? It's very similar, overall, to loading your pistol caliber ammunition, except you have to pay much more attention to consistency with powder charge weight, bullet weight, bullet diameter, bullet lubrication and

cartridge length. At a high level, this is the loading process:

- Start with clean brass, including primer pockets. Since the brass is used in only one rifle, I do not resize it before reloading. It is fireformed and already fits the chamber perfectly, so why mess with it?
- Prime cases
- Charge with powder. Most sources will tell you that a variance of plus or minus one grain in charge weight in rifle cases will have no significant impact on accuracy, so they recommend to just use your powder measure to throw the charges. I tend to be somewhat obsessive in this area and will throw my charges a little light and then use a powder trickler and digital scale to bring them to the exact weight I want.
- Insert an over powder wad to keep bullet lube from contaminating the powder, as well as protect the base of the bullet from hot powder gases. Both fiber and polyethylene wads are available, but most people tend to use 0.030" or 0.060" fiber wads.
- Compress the powder charge so when the bullet is seated on top of it, you have the proper overall length for the cartridge.
- Seat the bullet.
- Crimp the cartridge just enough to take out any mouth bell required for seating and grip the bullet sufficiently so it won't fall out of the case when handling.

As you can see, the mechanics of loading the black powder rifle cartridge are simple. The trick is in coming up with the proper "formula" for the recipe. As mentioned in previous articles, you don't want any air space in the loaded cartridge. In addition, most rifles perform best with the bullet seated near the rifling, or even slightly engaging the rifling. This means you'll

have a minimum powder charge you start with for your ammunition that fills the case to the base of the bullet without compression. Then you incrementally increase the charge to the point you optimize your accuracy. This is probably somewhere in the range of five percent more powder than the "full, no compression" charge. However — "your mileage may vary!"

There are also quite a few different bullet designs and your rifle may show a distinct preference for one over the others. One thing you really don't want is a wide flat point bullet as they are much less aerodynamically efficient. There is also the traditional grease groove bullet and the paper patched bullet. While a significant number of top competitors like the paper patched bullet, that gets into "graduate level" reloading and we won't deal with that here. They aren't necessary and you can explore that later on your own if you like.

In addition to bullet design, you must consider consistency in the weight of the bullet and the type and amount of lubricant used. Most competitors think you need to keep the bullet weights within plus or minus one grain within a batch of ammunition for best accuracy. As well, you need the bullet to carry enough lube (remember — black powder lube, not the colored crayon stuff used commercially for cast bullets intended for use with smokeless powder) to leave a "lube star" on the muzzle of the rifle. This indicates the bullet has enough lube to keep the fouling moist in the entire bore of the rifle.


There are some companies (Montana Bullet Works, Buffalo Arms, etc.) that sell bullets meeting these specifications, and they are a good source for you to start your journey. However, the need for weight consistency, adequate lube capacity, cost, etc. are the reason many folks involved in long range ultimately start casting their own bullets. Don't let this idea scare you, though—casting is really not difficult. We can address that in another article if there is sufficient interest.

The powder itself has a major influence on accuracy. As we're all aware, black powder comes in mul-

tiple grain sizes, ranging from Cannon, to Fg, 1.5-Fg, FFg, FFFg and FFFFg. The more "Fs" the finer the granulation of the powder. In addition, the quality of the various powder brands varies. The different brands of powders use different kinds of wood to make their charcoal, which has an effect. The less expensive brands also tend to have more "fines" (or dust) in the powder, which adds inconsistency. The best performing powders tend to use low density wood for their charcoal (Alder, etc.) and better sieve the powder for much better overall consistency of grain size (no fines). All that being said, consensus opinion is the two best powders for long range accuracy are Swiss and Goex Olde Eynsford. You can get by with using the cheapest powder for normal Cowboy matches, but for long range you must use the

In general, the smaller calibers use finer grain powder, and the larger calibers use coarser powders.

- FFFg powder is used up to the .40 caliber cartridges.
- FFg is used from the .40 caliber up.





• 1.5-Fg is also popular from .45 caliber up.

Primers are another factor that can affect accuracy. While it may seem that would be trivial, I've seen too much data that showed simply changing a primer brand, regular versus magnum, etc. has made a significant difference. It doesn't take much change to make a big difference at 500 to 1,000 yards!

So in summary, beyond the bare mechanics of loading, which are quite simple, you will experiment with the following to obtain your best load.

- Bullet style and weight. Heavier bullets tend to be more stable at longer ranges.
- Bullet weight consistency.
- Cartridge overall length.
- Powder charge weight and amount of compression.
- Powder granulation.
- Primer type.

REMEMBER — only change one thing at a time! If you change two or more factors you'll never know which of them caused the different results. In fact, one of them may have improved group size, while the other(s) caused it to get worse.

A good single shot rifle of modern manufacture is very capable of sub-MOA accuracy. It's really rewarding to learn what a good rifle with vernier sights is capable of. Who needs a stinkin' scoped rifle?

LEVER ACTION RIFLES

Almost everything discussed above also applies to lever action rifles. The major differences are:

- Lever action rifles require a flat point bullet due to the magazine.
- Bullets must be seated to fit within the length requirements of the rifle action. Thus, you won't be able to seat them out to contact the rifling, you'll seat them to the depth required for the crimp groove in the bullet.
- If you want lever rifles of modern design and manufacture, two excellent choices are the Marlin 336 (in .30-30 and .38-55), Marlin 1895 (in .45-70), the Winchester 1894 (in .30-30 and

.38-55,) and the Winchester 1886 (in .45-70). The Italian companies make a modern reproduction of the Winchester 1876 in calibers like the .40-60, .45-60, .45-75 and .50-95.

Within these constraints, you will still experiment with:

- Bullet weight and consistency.
- Powder granulation.
- Powder charge and compression.
- Primer.

A good lever rifle can get near MOA accuracy. I have two Marlins (a .38-55 and a .45-70) that will shoot at or under 1.5 MOA. Don't let anyone tell you lever guns are not accurate!

So, as the saying goes, "try it, you'll like it!" Attend one of your local long range matches and I'm sure the folks there will put one of these smoke poles in your hands. You'll be hitting the 500- and 600-yard targets very shortly. On the way home you'll be working on your justification to your spouse why you need that new Sharps or High Wall — and that you really need to go to Montana to properly spec one out!



SHOT SHELL BASICS

while back I noticed a post on the SASS Wire asking whether shotgun primers are interchangeable. There were numerous responses and every single respondent opined that shotgun primers are interchangeable. All of these responses were WRONG! Shotgun primers are not fully interchangeable — each brand has different physical dimensions and more importantly different burn/heat rates. Twelve gauge shotgun shells are loaded to a maximum average pressure (MAP) of 11,500 psi. This is far less pressure than even a standard .38 Special generates. Every reloading manual and powder company website shows very detailed recipes for shot shell loads. They list hull brand, powder type, powder charge weight, shot material (lead, steel, bismuth, etc.), shot weight, type of wad, and primer by brand. Switch primers and the recipes (and pressures) change. Shot shell loading has so many variables they cannot be covered in a short article. So we will explore some very basic things to consider when preparing to load shot shells.

PRIMERS

Photo 1 shows two primers that have been broken down into their parts. On the left there are two battery cups, in the center two anvils and to the right two primer cups. I put a magnet on the parts and all but one stuck to the magnet. The battery cup and anvils are steel in all primers (Photo 2). The primer cup itself can be steel or brass. More and more shot shell production is going to steel components and the only way to tell if a primer cup is brass is to take a 1/16" punch to a fired primer and take it apart and then touch the primer cup with a magnet. (You have to disassemble the primer or the steel anvil will make the primer cup appear to be steel.) Some guns do not like steel primers and will get misfires and some do not like steel case heads, with the case sticking in the chamber. For example the Federal Top Gun and the Estate shells both have steel heads









and all steel primers. Top Gun and Estate are both made in the same plant and both are owned by Federal.

Shown in Photo 3 are a Winchester primer on the left and a Federal primer on the right. They are both 209 primers but are quite different. The Winchester is shaped like a "T" whereas the Federal is shaped like a "Y." In the photo, the yellow arrow













is at the bottom of the T and the red arrow at the bottom of the Y. The Y shape makes the Federal primer's body shorter. This funnel shape is even more apparent from the top (Photo 4). The flare makes the primer cup sit deeper in the battery cup. The Y shape can affect how the primer seats in a hull. Sometimes the flared part of the primer will stick out above the hull rim a few thousands of an inch while the T shape sits flush. This can cause hulls with Federal primers to drag in some progressive reloading machines and can cause some problems with primer feeding systems. Interestingly, the Federal primers sold for reloading are all steel. Many foreign primers are larger in diameter than American-made primers. These can stretch the primer pocket and if American primers are used thereafter they can be loose or fall out of the primer pocket.

HULLS

Let us look at the two most popular hulls for reloading, the Remington STS and the Winchester AA (includes Nitros — the only difference is the color; AAs also come in different colors). Photo 5 shows an AA, STS, and a fired AA and STS. Notice the AA is shorter. Reloading machines adjusted for one or the other often need to have their settings changed when moving from one length to the other. Another consideration is that AA hulls have less internal capacity so some powder/ charge/shot combinations simply do not crimp well even though they may be listed as safe in the manuals. Being safe and having a decent crimp are often two different things. STSs are more forgiving in their load recipes.

The next consideration is basic hull construction. There are two designs that make up 99 percent of the shot shell market. The first design is the tapered hull like the STS and AA. This means the wall thickness of the plastic gets thicker towards the heads of the hulls. The second design is the Reifenhauser hull (commonly known as euro-trash hulls.) On a Reifenhauser hull the plastic remains the same thickness from the crimp to the head. These are straight walled hulls. Photo 6 shows a Remington STS on the left, a Winchester AA in the middle and an

Estate on the right. The Remington and Winchester hulls go from .020" to .080" at the base. The Reifenhauser hull is .020" for its entire length. It is hard to see the taper on the STS hull because of the color but part of the taper is clearly visible on the AA. See yellow arrows in Photo 6.

Photo 7 shows a Remington STS on the left and a Reifenhauser on the right, both with their metal heads removed. Even with the brass removed the STS still has a solid onepiece head and a primer pocket. The Reifenhauser is formed from a straight piece of plastic tube. Photo 8 shows how the Reifenhauser is constructed. A piece of plastic tube has a plastic (or fiber) insert placed in the tube and then the metal rim is crimped on. The STS and AA are the only hulls left that have brass heads. The hulls made in Europe and many of the non-STS and AA hulls made in the U.S. are Reifenhauser as they are much cheaper to produce. All of these hulls have steel heads regardless of their color. (There are no aluminum head hulls.)

The best hulls for reloading are the Remington STS series followed closely by Winchester AAs. Probably the next best hull for reloading is the Remington Gun Club. These are basically STS's with steel heads. I use these for black powder. The secret to making sure they shuck OK is to size the case heads with a Mec Super Sizer (Photo 9) before running them through your loader. Brass heads expand and then contract when fired and are much easier on loader dies than steel based hulls. The steel based hulls expand but do not contract and running them through the Super Sizer squeezes them back to factory specs.

WADS AND SHOT


The difference between tapered hulls and straight hulls also means there are specific wads designed for each type. It is not a good idea to put wads designed for tapered hulls in straight wall hulls or wads designed for straight wall hulls in tapered hulls as they often do not make a good gas seal when the charge is ignited and the pressures can be dramatically different. There are dozens of different wads to accommodate different hull types,





powders, and shot weight combinations. Photo 10 shows the three most popular Winchester wads. The gray WAA12L for 7/8 ounce, the pink WAA 12SL for 1 ounce and the white WAA12 for 1-1/8 ounce loads. An interesting fact is Winchester does not actually make any 7/8 ounce 12 gauge loads. They make 24 gram International loads, which are slightly less than 7/8 ounce, and 26 gram loads (used in the "Feather Lites") which are actually 15/16 ounce. Winchester factory shells use ball powders which take up less space in their hulls than flake powders. Thus the gray WAA12L wad will often "tent" the crimps if loaded with flake powders and 7/8 ounce of shot. Many loaders will, therefore, use the WAA12SL one ounce wad when loading 7/8 ounce with flake powders to get a proper crimp. Again there are almost an infinite number of hull, wad, and shot combinations that may or may not yield good crimps even though the load is listed in a manual. You simply have to experiment until you get a load you like and then document what components you used.

Next a word about shot and shot column stack height. If you are loading a "one" ounce load, for example, your chances that the shot actually weighs one ounce are about zero. Hard shot produces better patterns and it is hardened by adding antimony. Antimony weighs less than pure lead and right now shot antimony content varies all over the map. In addition, smaller shot packs tighter than larger shot so more will fit in the same space. This will make number 8 shot weigh more than 7-1/2 shot when measured from the same bushing. Most generic shot bushings are expected to load anything from #2 to #9. Thus most are averaged for #6 shot. If shot

weight is important (e.g., competition) bushings can be purchased for a specific shot size to get the weight closer to the desired weight. Photo 11 shows bushings for #7-1/2, #8, and #9 shot.

MISCELLANEOUS CONSIDERATIONS

Hopefully everyone is aware loading manual recommendations for powder bushings are simply starting points. The charges have to be weighed and bushings changed to get the desired powder weight. There can be a big difference in weight from a bushing used in a single stage press versus a progressive press. If your loading manual is fifty years old it is time to get a new one. Powder formulations have changed over the years. For CAS the reformulation that affects many shooters is Clays powder. The "old" Clays was made in Australia. The "new" Clays is made in Canada. They are not the same density. Generally Canadian Clays requires a smaller bushing than that used for Australian Clays.

Most CAS shotgun targets are at point blank range and many of our guns are fairly light in weight. So low recoil is often a key consideration in selecting ammo. Many factory rounds are still marked in drams. A dram is an old black powder weight that equals 27.34 grains. In the old days the only way to get more power was to use more powder. So a three dram load has more power than a two dram load. With smokeless powder, if more power is needed a powder with a different burn rate is used. But people still wanted to be able to get an idea about relative power so drams is often still used as a way to compare loads. The way things shake out most often is that 1-1/8 ounce, 1235+ fps (feet per second) or 3-1/4 dram loads are heavy or handicap loads; 1200 fps or three dram loads are considered heavy target loads and 1145 fps are considered light target loads; 1 ounce 1180 fps or 2-3/4 dram loads are extra light target loads. The most popular round for CAS is the Winchester Low Recoil, Low Noise (AKA Feather Lite) a "minimum dram" 26 gram (15/16 ounce) load at 900 fps.

Primers and other components are not freely interchangeable. So is there a saving grace for CAS loaders? Fortunately, many are loading at the very bottom or in many cases below the minimum charges listed in the loading manuals and on the powder manufacturers websites. This has saved them from possible harm that might result from higher loading levels.

APPETITE FOR DESTRUCTION THE STORY OF BOONE HELM

evi Boone Helm, also known as the "Kentucky Cannibal," was born January 28, 1828, in Lincoln County, Kentucky. When he was young, his family moved to Missouri and resided in Jackson Township. Not much is known about Helm's early life other than he was athletic and a good horseman. It is said that he could throw a Bowie knife into the ground and retrieve it at a full gallop.

Helm also distinguished himself by his complete lack of respect for the law or any other kind of authority. After a sheriff attempted to arrest him (the reason is unclear), he responded by riding his horse into a circuit court and haranguing the judge. Helm got off without serious punishment. This early incident probably convinced him he could do anything he wanted with impunity.

In 1852, 17-year-old Lucinda Browning had the extreme misfortune of becoming Helm's wife. The couple had a daughter, but Helm's penchant for drunkenness and wife beating caused Lucinda to file for divorce. The fact the divorce was granted is telling — marriage and child-rearing were considered "hands-on" activities in those days. In other words, Helm's behavior had to have been especially brutal.

Helm's father had virtually bankrupted himself from the legal ordeal. Since Helm couldn't afford a lawyer or to pay court costs, he borrowed the money from his family. It was the beginning of a familiar pattern. I'm sure everyone was relieved when Boone, as he was called, announced he was going to try his luck in the goldfields of California.

The original plan was Helm was to be accompanied by his cousin, Littlebury Shoot, on the journey west. Unfortunately, Shoot backed out at the last

minute. Helm's response was to fly into a rage. He fatally stabbed his cousin in the chest. This convinced Helm to hasten his departure, thus setting what was to become another familiar pattern. Helm was the sort of person who wore out his welcome quickly.

Littlebury Shoot's friends and immediate relatives pursued Helm and managed to capture him. He was judged to be insane and placed in an asylum. Unfortunately, he managed to escape.

With an even greater sense of urgency, Helm continued to California. In the 1850s the West was a great place to go if you needed to start a new life. It was also an ideal destination if you happened to be a psychopathic murderer. Because it was thinly populated and barely governed, you could get away with almost anything if your luck held.

The overland journey from Missouri to California was arduous in the 1850s. During his trip, Helm killed an

unspecified number of people. Whether he killed them out of rage, self-defense, or sport is unknown. What is known is he acquired the nickname "Kentucky Cannibal" during this period. He seemed to revel in his notoriety. Later he boasted, "Many's the poor devil I've killed at one time or another and the time has been that I've been obliged to feed on some of 'em."

Mining is hard work. Boone Helm found it much easier to rob, murder, and steal from the people who labored in the goldfields. He also enjoyed drinking and brawling. Several dead bodies were left in his wake. Once again, the records are sketchy about how many people he killed or what his motives were. It appears he found killing to be a hobby. There is nothing to suggest he felt even a shred of remorse. After a few months, the folks in California developed a strong distaste for the Kentucky Cannibal. He wisely chose to leave before he was captured and strung up.

In 1853, Helm showed up in Oregon with several other shady characters. It was during this period that he made his boast about eating human flesh.

Why they continued to hang out with him after hearing that is a mystery. My only guess is they weren't particularly upstanding citizens themselves. Furthermore, Helm was a formidable figure and perhaps they thought he might provide security.

Late in the year, Helm and five other men decided to travel to Fort Hall, Idaho. An Indian attack forced them to make a detour into the wilderness. Winter set in and their horses had to be killed. Soon whatever food they had ran out. Four of the six men died. Helm and the other survivor stumbled on toward Fort Hall. Eventually Burton, whose first name is not recorded, could go no farther. Helm continued by himself in order to get help. When he arrived at the fort, he discovered it had been abandoned.

Retracing his steps, Helm claimed he got close enough to Burton to hear him shoot himself. (The veracity of Helm's story is questionable; he may well have shot Burton himself.) At any rate, Burton's body was butchered and devoured except for a leg, which Helm carried with him so he would have something to eat while he was wandering around. As luck would have it, this turned out to be the "last leg" of Helm's ordeal. He blundered into a friendly Indian camp and was soon rescued by the famed surveyor/explorer John Wes-

ley Powell. (There is some disagreement about this; it may be the John W. Powell mentioned in some sources had a coincidental name.)

Powell guided Helm to Salt Lake City. Apparently, Helm had no qualms about telling his rescuer how he managed to survive. Who knows what Powell must have thought? Cannibalism was not unheard of out West — the tragedy of the Donner Party was well known. Moreover, the practice was so common among sailors that it was called 'the custom of the sea." If I were traveling with Helm, I would have kept a loaded revolver close by. At the very least I would have made sure he didn't skip any meals.

Once he reached Salt Lake City, Helm lived it up by boozing and brawling. He had plenty of money because he had taken it from his dead companions. According to some sources he hired himself out as a "Danite," an assassin for the Mormon church. However, it's difficult to verify the assertion because the church denies the existence of such people in the 1850s; they had supposedly been disbanded more than a decade before. There are rumors he ate some of his victims as well. Whatever the truth

is, the folks in Utah became fed up with Helm and he had to leave in a hurry. He returned to California.

In California, the pattern of Helm's life reasserted itself. There was more violence, thievery, murder, and mayhem. He wore out his welcome quickly. Later it was discovered he had robbed and killed a California rancher who had befriended him. There is no evidence that he ate the man.

Helm continued to leave a trail of chaos in his wake. In 1862, he appeared in Oregon where he shot and killed an unarmed man during a drunken dispute. The crime was so blatant, Helm had to flee into the wilderness to avoid the man's vengeful friends. He had a companion with him in the beginning, but the companion was eaten after they ran out of food.

This time, the authorities were able to apprehend Helm. He wriggled free of the situation by enlisting the help of his brother, "Old Tex" Helm, who paid off the witnesses. According to another source, nobody wanted to testify against Helm. Whatever the reason, the miscreant was released and accompanied his brother to Texas.

By 1864, Helm had made his way to Montana. He joined a gang led by Henry Plummer, a colorful figure who was both a sheriff and an outlaw. Plum-

mer's gang was ironically called "The Innocents." Their specialty was robbing wagons returning from the mining fields.

Finally, enough was enough. The citizens of Bannack and Virginia City, Montana captured Plummer and several of The Innocents, including Boone Helm. Plummer was hanged on January 10, 1864, in Bannack. Four days later, in Virginia City, Helm and some of the other Innocents met their fates. Helm had claimed all his crimes were perpetrated by one of his friends. It didn't work. The residents of Virginia City had had their fill of the Kentucky Cannibal.

Helm died without remorse or fear. With a rope around his neck, standing before a huge crowd, his last words were "Every man for his principles! Hurrah for Jeff Davis! Let her rip!" Before the hangman could kick the box out from under him, he jumped. Like the traitorous Thane of Cawdor in Shakespeare's Macbeth, "Nothing so became him in life, like the leaving of it."

Boone Helm is credited with 11 confirmed murders, but the actual tally is likely to be much higher. Many of the sources about the creature—I hesitate to call him a man—are sketchy. He's relatively obscure at present, but that is about to change. A movie about him has been produced. He's billed as "America's Original Serial Killer," but

that's not accurate. That title goes to the Harpe brothers, also from Kentucky, who killed more than 50 people during the late 18th and early 19th centuries. It should be noted that the Harpes were the first documented serial killers; they probably had plenty of predecessors.

There is also a play called The Belle and Boone Helm, which was put on by the Cincinnati Fringe Festival this summer. Perhaps I should throw my hat in the ring and choreograph a dance rendition of Helm's life. I might as well set my sights high and invite the Bolshoi Ballet to do the performance. They would probably leap at the chance to get out of Russia.



He flew his own airplane, participated in Tae Kwon Do as a fourth-degree black belt, and was a World Champion mounted Cowboy Action Shooter. They would go to a shoot and spend one day shooting the whole ground match, and the next two days shooting the mounted event. It was hard, but



they always managed to do well.

When they traveled to the Worlds, it was always in April. In Idaho, the horses still have long hair and are a bit wild and wooly. They were always a sight to be seen. But they always managed to put on a show to remember.


El Jefe was able to showcase his sport at the 2002 Winter Olympics in Utah. Here he won the award for his division. He also won a World Championship on his Mounted Shooting horse, Patch, and several national and regional titles. SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The Cowboy Chronicle welcomes and encourages submissions of articles and match reports from any and all readers.

Please submit articles in MS Word or something compatible. Open Office and Apple Pages (saved as MS Word) are also fine. A count of 500-800 words is a good target to shoot for, but shorter pieces are also fine. Match reports on larger events, like END of TRAIL, Winter Range, and Regional and Divisional matches may run 1000-1500 words if necessary. We will accept lengthier articles, but may choose to break them up into two or more parts to run in consecutive issues, or heavily edit them.

Please do not embed your photos in the Word document. They can be extracted for use in the *The Cowboy Chronicle*, but it can be a chore to do that. Instead, send your photos separately, in one or more emails, as attachments. Three to six photos per email usually works best. It's best to send JPEGs, but other formats are acceptable, and it's best to keep them at about 300 dpi and 3000 pixels (10 inches) on the short side. That size is

ideal and will allow us plenty of leeway when it comes to cropping and adjusting them for publication. Photos should be at least 1000 pixels on the short side to be used for publication. If you're unsure of the size of your pictures, or how to size them, send what you have and we'll adjust them and/or inform you if they're usable.

Usually, two to six photos are sufficient for an article, but we will consider using more for a "big" event, if provided. Photos need not have captions, but captions always make photos more interesting. Ideally, the caption would consist of one or two sentences that say something about the picture that is not obvious and/or is not implicit in the body of the article. "Sam making smoke" is a title but not a caption. "Sam, SASS #XXXXX, shooting his first black powder match; after much deliberation, he decided to give it a try and now he's hooked" is much better. A caption may also serve to let everyone know why the picture is worthy of being published in an international magazine.
