

### LAND RUN 2024

#### THE SASS NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS

he state of Oklahoma is the quintessential land of Cowboys and Indians. Practically in the middle of the USA, Oklahoma offers up a cultural medley that is genuine Americana. That red dirt is steeped in authenticity and holds the history of the west, and on any given day you'll see plenty of cowboy boots and hats around every corner. Southern hospitality is more than a cultural stereotype in Oklahoma; it is a way of life. SASS members got to experience the warmth of our hosts — and the abundant Oklahoma sunshine — as more than 700 competitors descended upon the Oklahoma City Gun Club for Land Run, the SASS National Championship of Wild Bunch Action Shooting $^{\text{\tiny M}}$  and Cowboy Action Shooting $^{\text{\tiny M}}$  in October.

Land Run kicked off on Saturday, October 5 with the Wild Bunch Action Shooting Championship, presented by the Oklahoma Rough Riders, with warm ups and an opening reception in the pavilion with small bites — offering the 75 competitors the opportunity to share smiles of reunion and friendship. The Wild Bunch main match was contested over the next two days, culminating in a Top Gun Shoot Off at the Adobe Wall. After which, the Shoot Off winners, the impressive Lady Jane (SASS #72857) and Don Jorge (SASS #37131) joined their fellow competitors in the pavilion for a delicious dinner prior to awards. Having become a Land Run tradition, dinner included the much-anticipated chicken fried

steak with all the trimmings. While Oklahoma doesn't claim to be the spot of origin for chicken fried steak, it is actually included as part of Oklahoma's official state meal! (That's right, the only state to actually have an official state meal.) Our hosts certainly perfected it, prompting all in attendance to loudly chant "Chicken Fried Steak!" in appreciation. Following dinner, Hondo Tweed (SASS #99043), the Wild Bunch Action Shooting Match Director, led the awards presentation. The room brimmed with applause and congratulations for side match winners and all those who placed across the main match shooting categories. Sarsaparilla (SASS #107188) took home the Overall Men's title, alongside Lady Jane, who earned the Overall Lady title, marking 2024 as her fifth National Overall win — a testament to her dedication and phenomenal skill as a competitive shooter.

The Oklahoma Territorial Marshals took the reins of the range on Tuesday, October 8 and the 2024 SASS Cowboy Action Shooting National Championship was underway! Tuesday and Wednesday served up plenty of sunshine and an abundance of activities for the nearly 700 competitors of the Cowboy Action Shooting main event. Loads of warm up opportunities, clinics, long-range matches, cowboy clays, and side matches galore filled the event schedule as the range bristled with activity and overflowed with reunions and laughter. Bargains abounded in the afternoon at the swap meet with loads of clothing, accessories and firearms.

On Wednesday evening, the events Opening Ceremonies were held at the National Cowboy and Western Heritage Museum in Oklahoma City, America's premier institution of western history, art, and culture. The Museum hosted a special opening of the exhibits and the museum store exclusive for Land Run attendees, and most folks explored and soaked in the rich western heritage on display before making their way to the banquet hall. The opening ceremonies offered light hors d'oeuvres and drinks and kicked off with an impressive color guard presentation by the Edmond North High School ROTC, and the singing of our national anthem by Tonic Kid (SASS


#70340). Amidst the social chatter and the clinking of glasses, the evening rounded off with sponsor thanks, event information, and the presentation of the SASS Wooly Awards.

Thursday morning the range was abuzz early in the morning as the first wave of contestants made their way to their designated stages. A day dedicated to the shooting competition, the activity continued throughout the day Thursday under a hot Oklahoma sun, with temperatures in the low 90s. Friday continued the vie for the National titles and culminated in an evening "on the range" that offered up a myriad of social activities for everyone. Vendors stayed open for evening shopping with free beer and giveaways courtesy of Mernickle Holsters. There was spirit sampling and cigars in the Saloon, the pavilion hosted a delicious shrimp boil with all the fixins, and of course, margaritas! The Oklahoma Territorial Marshals "Town" was brimming with cowboys and cowgirls awash in camaraderie, spending time with friends old and new, sharing laughter, triumphs, and the occasional heartache from the field of competition.

Saturday presented the final leg of the Cowboy Action Shooting National Championship stages as the three shifts of shooters convened upon the range throughout the day. The range cleared out early as folks began to ready themselves for the grand finale of Land Run — the Awards banquet held at the National Cowboy & Western Heritage Museum. Many in attendance donned their finest attire — and some very creative — as one area of the Museum lobby brimmed with contestants for the costume contest. The Costume contest was spearheaded by SASS' Costuming Administrator, Shotglass (SASS #17153) and the judges panel had a tough task as contestants presented impressive displays full of creativity and fun, paying homage to a myriad of characters of the Old West. In the end, Shotglass took the stage during the























awards ceremony and presented honors to those who reigned supreme.

The Museum exhibits and store were again exclusively open for Land Run participants — a treasure to bestow. Portraits were offered by Paparazzi Pahl and Snapshot Nellie (SASS #113912) of Paparazzi Pahl Photography, and the bars were open for cocktails and conversation in the hallways of the facility in anticipation of the Banquet hall's opening.

The banquet revealed itself to be among the top tier in hospitality. Beautifully appointed table settings and a full-service experience, the staff ensured all tables were served the delicious three-course meal with friendliness and efficiency. Upon conclusion of the meal, Flat Top Okie (SASS #80827) took the stage and kicked off the awards presentation. The audience got comfortable, and as Okie made his way through varying award placements in more than 50 side matches and 53 main match categories, the room erupted with applause and congratulations. About 12 percent of the competitors — 82 — shot the match clean, among them rose Dead Eye Dillard (SASS #23582) and Gunslinger Grace (SASS #81768), clinching the Overall National Champion titles for overall man and lady. Congratulations and farewells alike filled the room as the awards presentation concluded and the evening ended. The grand finale of Land Run may have concluded, but there was still one more event in store — the Top Gun Shoot Off on Sunday morning. Amidst the packing up of exhibitors and the flurry of activity in breaking down and cleaning up the event, contestants made their way to the Adobe Wall stage. Despite most folks heading for home on Sunday, the Top Gun Shoot off drew a small group of contestants as well as onlookers, friends, and family. When the dust settled, Oklahoma Dee, (SASS #44562) took Top Gun Man and Oopsie Daisy (SASS #96130) took Top Gun Lady.

Land Run 2025, the SASS National Championship of Cowboy Action Shooting and Wild Bunch Action Shooting, presented by the Oklahoma Territorial Marshals, will be held October 4-11, 2025. Registration opens January 15. You don't want to miss it!


#### **MEMBERSHIP**

Brunelle (SASS #2495), Sassy Dancer (SASS #70118), and Deuce Stevens (SASS #55996). The SASS Range Operations Committees for both WBAS and CAS play an integral role in the governance of their respective disciplines, and we are grateful and humbled by their volunteer service.

#### SASS CLASSES

This year will also bring about an exciting fresh new experience for Range Safety Courses in the SASS Shooting Sports world. A concerted effort to streamline Range Safety Courses without compromising quality — has been undertaken. SASS certified range safety courses will now consist of a SASS Basic Range Safety Course one course that covers all of the shared SASS Safety covenants, range safety standards, expectations, and conventions, regardless of discipline. Separately, the SASS range safety courses will also offer a Cowboy Action Shooting module and a Wild Bunch Action Shooting module, each with detailed course content specific to each discipline and each with the prerequisite of the basic safety course. These new courses will offer more flexibility and opportunity for instructors to present the material appropriately and efficiently, eliminating the time-suck that was once required to attend a SASS RO Course, even for a refresher course. We anticipate growing the program into several online options as we move forward, to increase attendance and

further education. Additionally, SASS is extending instructor certifications from a two-year term to a five-year term, easing the administrative burden on SASS and SASS certified instructors alike. Our next task through 2025 is to revitalize the Match Directors guides, construct introductory clinic materials, and further enhance the content and measure of our resources for SASS affiliated clubs.


#### PROJECT IRON HORSE

#### **EPITOME OF THE COWBOY WAY**

had the privilege of attending the 2024 Uprising at Swearing Creek the North Carolina state match — in late October and early November. The main match took place on a Friday and Saturday with the awards banquet taking place on Saturday evening.

I was fortunate in that I was a category winner. After receiving my award I was returning to my seat when I had an unfortunate accident. My foot slipped off a stair and I tumbled down in excruciating pain. I'm not sure exactly what I did but I know I did something bad to my left knee and the muscle above it.

It couldn't have been more than a minute and people were there, trying to help me get up. The pain was so bad there was no way I could stand. After a very brief interval I heard someone

say, "If you are not certified, get back." Immediately, there were at least five certified paramedics/EMT/fire fighters helping me. They lifted me into a chair and while one of them supported my leg the others picked up the chair and carried me to the elevator. Once the elevator was on the ground floor I was carried to my waiting car where a couple other Cowboys were waiting.

I was driven to the local hospital emergency room and the two people who had driven me stayed with me until my daughter arrived at the ER. That was about 1:30 a.m. In the ER, X-Rays were taken and subsequently a CT scan was done. There was some concern upon looking at the X-Rays that I might have broken my hip. Fortunately, nothing was broken.

My daughter drove me to her house (about an hour away) and we arrived there at about 4:30 a.m. She and her husband helped me into the house where I stayed for an additional three days. I finally was able to get into my car and made the trip home to Michigan. It wasn't easy and I was in pain the entire trip.

I would like to express my gratitude to the people who helped me to my car and to Buckshot Betty (SASS #114614) and Woodchuck Willy (SASS #114613) who drove me to the hospital. This is truly the "Cowboy Way."

#### SHOOTOUT AT BOUNTY GULCH 2024 SASS CANADIAN NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

**uly 26 – August 4, 2024** — The Canadian National Championship of Cowby Action Shooting<sup>™</sup> was held for the first time near Saskatoon Saskatchewan Canada at a gun range called "Bounty Gulch." #### GUNSMOKE 2024 MIDWEST REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP

t long last, after many months of planning and weeks of preparations, the big battle was over and the gun smoke had cleared enough to see there was peace and quiet in Cedar Valley again. The Vigilantes had overcome all odds and were again victorious. Marshals Deuce Stevens (SASS #55996) and Cowboy Carty (SASS #86059), assisted by deputies J.B. Kidd (SASS #88820), Riverboat Red (SASS #71733), Just Ed (SASS #108405) and many others had performed another heroic feat in preparing for and managing this fiercely fought battle, and settling the ensuing (mostly) silent crowd of Vigilantes down for a final meal at the Lucky Lady to celebrate the results.

Gunsmoke, the official SASS Midwest Regional Championship was held again at Ahlman's Custom Gun Shop and Shooting Range in Morristown, MN, home of the host club Cedar Valley Vigilantes. There were 185 shooters registered in 38 categories and countless watchers and cheerleaders in attendance September 18-21, 2024. Our shooters came from Arizona, Arkansas, Colorado, Connecticut, Florida, Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, New Mexico, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, and Wisconsin. Next year you'll want to add your state to this growing list!

Ahlman's is a privately owned facility, remote but not far from Morristown. They sell guns and parts and have gunsmithing and training with sight-in ranges handy, not to mention ammo and reloading components. It is a large facility also containing a trap/skeet range, two Cowboy wings of villages, and more shooting ranges as well as the well-stocked gun shop. There is also a super-large dance hall — the Lucky Lady — that works well for the folks who have guns and gear to sell at the flea market as well as for the raffle, sit down dinner, and awards ceremony. The venue also has ample room for camping, making this an all-inclusive site where you dont have to drive anywhere unless you run out of

vittles or such. Roberts Food Truck was again in attendance for those who were hungry but couldn't get their campfires going. With ample room for vendors to set up in their designated vending spots and the indoor convenience of the dance hall, all our vendors really like Gunsmoke and keep returning year after year.

Talking to Deuce, Carty and JB over lunch one day, these wide-ranging cowpokes managed to convey to me what they thought was special about Gunsmoke and its venue at Ahlman's. Deuce said this was his 19th year shooting at Gunsmoke and fifth year as co-Match Director with Carty. They went on to explain what they thought made this shoot so special — namely, the all-inclusive nature of the facility for campers, featuring a hot shower, Robert's food truck, and the Lucky Lady dance hall, so

no off-site trips are necessary. Also, the wide and deep stages provide for lots of side to side and down range movement, plus each bay has large timber berms that provide safety from adjacent stages.

The large stages with berms work well by allowing for movement down range and laterally, as well as multiple shooting areas at each storefront or stage, as the case may be. There were a variety of large steel targets that were set up close and provided for fast shooting times. As many Cowboys and Cowgirls found out though, close and large doesn't necessarily mean a clean shoot, but they were all fun. We did manage to have 64 clean shooters, with many more near misses.

CVV has an east village, with six storefront stages and a western range with more open stages and our very own Train stage. We were concerned early this summer with the wet conditions making access a problem. The work posse spent a lot of time on Stage 6, the train, improving drainage and reinforcing the flooring. Thankfully, the hot and dry conditions later in the summer left this stage firm and dry. The work posse also installed new flooring on three of the east stages, covering up those annoying cracks that tended to eat up a lot of brass.

Monday, September 16th was reserved for final range preparation and welcoming vendors. On Tuesday,






#### GREAT MAINE GUN FIGHT 2024 MAINE STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

**eptember 6-8, 2024** — If I told you six years goes by in a blink of an eye, you most likely would just think "yeah, sure." Well let me tell you, I never thought six years would go so fast. It seems like just yesterday it was my first time running the state shoot and here I stand writing this summary almost three weeks after the match. Cowboy Action has consumed my life, but in a good way. I love the sport and the woman I love also loves it, which makes it easy to play as much as we do. My wife and I tell people we shoot Cowboy every weekend, twice a weekend from the first of April to the first of November. For those of you who are in the south, we have this thing called winter where there is snow that doesn't allow us to shoot for four months. Every weekend rolls into the next, and then each month rolls into the next. We shoot monthlies, annuals, state matches, and even a regional. Our spring, summer and fall are weekends filled with Cowboy and we love it. The Cowboy family is what keeps us going back and that is why we run the state match, so we can host all our family and put on a match for all of them.

The Great Maine Gun Fight 2024 has come and went. A three-day match filled with camping, shooting, campfires, laughs, and beautiful weather. We tried to put on a show this year — I wanted to give our shooters the best experience possible. We have sold the match as the best bang for your buck in the country. At just \$50, shooters have enjoyed three days of shooting filled with the whole Cowboy experience. And our marketing has worked, in six short years we have doubled our attendance and we unexpectedly were at capacity this year. I will never turn anyone away — I want everyone to come and join the fun, but this year we grew by almost 25 percent since last year and it was tight. We had 106 registered shooters, and 92 shot the match, crushing last year's record. We ended up with four very full posses but we made do. The match had been written months in advance and the booklets were printed so the match was designed for four posses shooting a six and four schedule. So having 100-plus shooters signed up for the match was a pleasant surprise but it definitely threw a wrench in my plans for how the match would flow. We made it through just fine but it was a couple of long days with each posse taking more time on each stage but the posses ran well and we were able to get through it. I promised all the shooters next year would be better, and in the future because of the growth of attendance we will be using 10 bays and shooting more posses to keep the posse numbers down. All in all this is a problem we were glad to have, because the match is growing.

The match was a hit with very few issues other than posse size. The days were long, but we kept everyone entertained. This year we changed our long-range side event to eliminate timed shooting and make it an accuracy event only. Shooters tried to shoot five for five with different firearms in different positions and if they hit all five then there was a sudden death shoot off held at the end of the day. This went over really well and people seemed to enjoy it. It also helped that Rancho Roy (SASS #93544) provided 200 rounds and a couple of firearms for people to use and try out long range. We had a good attendance at long range and they even got a few new people to try









it out. We also tried something new on Saturday night. We implemented golfcart-mounted-shooting. Some friends here in the northeast have told stories of Comin' at Cha and the side by side shooting they do. So we tried our hand at it. Rancho Roy again was the driving factor behind this, since he had acquired a golf cart. Roy loaded 500 black powder .38 blanks, bought balloons, made a holster rig for his golf cart and then we tried it out. Shooters got to shoot 10 balloons sitting in the passenger seat of the golf cart. We have a Cowboy Town with thee bays on one side of the pit and three bays on the other side. Roy drove shooters down through Cowboy Town, shooting five balloons as they went. He got to the end of the road, turned around and came back, shooting five more balloons. It was quite the event. The ride lasted about 30-40 seconds and then we ran out to set new balloons. It went over quite well, being our first time trying it. We had a bunch of people blowing up balloons with pumps and air compressors and by mouth and we had a group running out as a team to reset balloons. We had about 40 shooters shoot the mounted event in about an hour and a half. It was real teamwork and it seemed to be a hit.

Every year we get questions from people not from Maine or New England as to where to go get a lobster dinner. Well this year we told people you could get one at the range. I must hear it 100 times — "Where can I get a lobster?" — well my goal was to one day have the funds to put on a lobster dinner at our match. This year we had two cowboys from Pennsylvania who wanted lobster but they wanted lobster at the range. I told them if you cook it I will help pay for it but they did one better for me. Dammit Gregory (SASS #100509) and Sparkle Gal (SASS #100510) not only offered to cook the lobsters, they offered to pay for them. They offered to pay for every shooter to get a lobster and they did so before we had all our applications in. We were surprised to order 100 lobsters, but they paid and cooked all of them with no questions asked. I had a friend who is a local lobsterman who delivered freshly caught lobsters to the range and then Greg and Sparkle went to work cooking. We usually do a potluck dinner so the lobster was added to the potluck. Everyone brought dishes to share and those who wanted lobster now had a chance to have or try a Maine lobster right at the range. It was such a tremendous donation made by Greg and Sparkle and I can't thank them enough. I'm hoping to put on a lobster and steak dinner in the future, but unfortunately shooters will have to pay for it. But I think after having this experience people will be happy to have a real Maine lobster at the Maine state shoot.

Well as for the shooting, it was the same old same old. We shot three days, side events, warm ups, speed and accuracy events on Friday, then Saturday and Sunday were the main match, then we did a tag team shoot off followed by awards. The weekend was as fast as you could read that last sentence. I tried to make the match as fun as I could. I tried to have a good selection of targets, distances and challenges to each stage. I used a lot more props than I usually do trying to give the Cowboy scenario a little more eye appeal. I wanted people to feel like they are in the Old West and that they are a cowboy in the story. All in all I think most people had fun. I think people coming back and spreading the word about our shoot is a sign people like it. I can't make everyone happy all of the time, but I can use enough variety in my match to try to appeal to all shooters a little bit. I want my match to continue to grow and I think it will improve little by little. Next year we will use more bays than ever to accommodate the influx of shooters. I never wanna put a cap on my match, but based on camping and parking I think we could handle 150 shooters. I don't know if we will ever be that big, but who knows, I hope it happens.

## A COWBOY ADVENTURE FROM THE FAR SIDE

Each stage featured its own western-themed Far Side cartoon. It wasn't uncommon to hear a Cowboy yelling a Gary Larson line like "Cattle shark!" or "Bad guy comin' in Arnie, minor key!"

But there was even more fun to be had than the main match. Spectators cheered on their fellow Cowboys and Cowgirls as they took their turns on the range in more wild west shenanigans. Competitors participated in Wild Bunch, Long Range, and the ever-popular Night Shoot, hosted by our own Justified (SASS #108968). The best part about the Night Shoot is the Fireball Trophy awarded to the Cowboy with the biggest boom!

"Cowboy matches are usually during the day and if you think watching black powder shooters is fun when it's light out," said Justified, "then you've got to come to a night match. 

#### COMANCHERIA DAYS 2024 BAGPIPES AND A BOOM

omancheria Days 2024 started off with Bagpipes and a Boom. Well not really, but we will circle back to that in a while.

The second oldest Cowboy Action Shooting™ club in Texas, the Texican Rangers, officially kicked off the 29th year of its annual match, Comancheria Days, April 11, 2024. The event was founded in 1995 by Mike Harvey (Texas Jack, SASS #5158), owner of Cimarron Firearms Co. and Texas Jack Wild West Outfitter, who has been the match sponsor every year since its inception.

The schedule actually began the day before, Wednesday, at 9:00 a.m., with Texas Jack Daniels (SASS # 8587) teaching the RO1 or refresher for those wanting to keep up to date with the rules. He is to be thanked for generously donating his time every year to keep the new ROs coming.

On Thursday, registration began bright and early at 7:30 for the early birds. A big thank you to Shooting Iron Miller (SASS #85410), Tombstone Mary (SASS #19524), and Barbara Williams for handling check in. Once again Texas Jack Daniels began teaching (the RO2 class) from 9:00-12:30 to bring everyone up to snuff. At the same time a four-stage Wild Bunch Match kicked off that lasted until 1:00 with 30 participants this year.

The Plainsman three-stage match went from 1:00 to 3:00 with nine shooters, and with Long Range overlapping from 10:00 to 3:00.

Side Matches for Fastest Rifle, Shotgun, Revolver, Derringer and Pocket Revolver, Fastest 1911 and BAMM (Bolt Action Military Match) rounded out the day from 1:00 to 4:30.

Friday the morning weather was pleasantly chilly and clear for the official kickoff of the main match. Registration began at 7:00 and lasted until 8:30. The festivities began with Sheriff Robert Love (SASS #8960) Match Director





and President of the Texican Rangers welcoming everyone, followed by Colonel Callan (SASS #73944) playing God Bless America on the bagpipes, immediately followed by the Pledge of Allegiance, the Texas Pledge, an invocation for safe shooting from Bisby Jackson (SASS #77610) and punctuated by Doc Holloman (SASS #110783) setting off the Rangers' cannon. I can't help but wonder what the neighbors thought.

The Main Match began with five stages on Friday. The Posses shoot either the lower half or the upper half of the range, then shoot the opposite stages on Saturday. petition. Dirty Sally's Mercantile was fun and running a great deal on garters. Lean Dog Productions was back again this year. Lone Star Leatherworks is always worth a visit to see Sam McDermott, swap stories, and check out the goods. Tell Sacket of Tell's Primers managed to part me from some of my money. Texas R3 Creations and White Wolf Trading rounded out the vendors. Then on to the afternoon's challenges...

Blazing Saddles is a hoot! It's a saddle cinched to a 55-gallon drum that rolls down a track. Revolvers are placed in pommel holsters, the rifle is fired at targets at the end of the track, handed off to one of the ROs, a release is engaged, and pistol targets are shot from the moving barrel. 

#### DISPATCHES FROM CAMP BAYLOR PROCAST HOLLOW BASED CLEAN MOLY COATED BULLETS

Procast Bullet Co. is a small business making five different bullets for competitors.

The home page of Procast states, "At Procast Bullet Company we make bullets exclusively for competition

shooters. As precision shooters we need accuracy and a nicely cut bullet hole to score. Procast Bullet Company delivers this with semi-wadcutters (for 9mm, .40 and .45); wadcutters for precision revolvers (.38/.357) and ultralight, hollow-backed autoloaders; and round nose, flat point bullets (.38/.357) for Cowboy Action Shooters<sup>™</sup> to run in their 1866, 1873, and 1892 race guns. All of our bullets are hardball 92/6/2 alloy. We use a revolutionary new CLEAN-MOLY (encapsulated molybdenum disulfide based) poly-lubricant that is much cleaner than the old moly-based lubricants and does the job very well."

This test is a few months late due

to an injury that still limits my activities. When I started on the test getting use of a CAS range for speed shooting wasn't possible before the last deadline.

#### WHY A HOLLOW RASES

First, I noted the bullet is about the size of a 158-grain RNFP and '66 and '73 rifles require an overall length of 1.44"+ (Some say 1.43", but I have encountered rifles that would lock up with 1.43".) Crimped into the crimp groove the overall length of the test bullets was 1.475". This is within the "sweet spot for use in SASS lever action rifles. Long ago it was discovered that a hollow base will expand when fired, imprinting into the rifling, and increas-

ing spin and accuracy. So, in this case, we have a hard bullet that goes deep into the rifling. I had planned to do Ransom Rest testing for accuracy but was unable to do so. Lacking a place to bolt in my Ransom Rest (courtesy of John Brownell, who was a fan of my articles) I planted my feet in a wide stance and carefully fired a one-hole group at 25 yards. (I will note that to save ammunition in these tough times I was shooting one-round groups.)

#### LOADING

The bullets looked very good, consistent, and no visible flaws. I weighed 20 bullets one at a time. The lightest bullet weighed 96.7 grains. The heaviest was 100.9 grains. The hollow base was consistent. They loaded easily, and all of the completed cartridges passed my rigorous quality control practices. (Okay, the upside-down primer didn't, but that didn't involve the bullet.)

### THE PROCAST DESCRIPTION MENTIONS RIFLES

The overall length, using the crimp groove, averaged 1.475". My 158s averaged 1.485". The guns cycle well in my '73s and hit targets smaller and more distant than any current SASS target. The rounds ran as well as 158-grain RNFP. I can see these satisfying a desire for some shooters to have a low recoiling round that will run as fast as 158 gr. rounds. Note the carrier for '66s and '73s is just short of 1.60". Tolerances being what they are, I won't load longer than 1.55". (This applies to .45 Colt rifles as well. I discovered it when I loaded some rounds to SAAMI specs of 1.60".) So the 1.47" round becomes 1.57" in .357 mag brass. It should work but test before using. Or just stick with .38 Special brass.

#### **CHRONOGRAPHING**

I could do the chronographing indoors because I use a Caldwell Precision G2 Chronograph. It appears to be upside down, but it has its own lights. It still missed a few shots of every group. It had trouble seeing the slowest bullets. But I got at least three good reads on every load.

I did the chronographing in a 4-5/8"-barreled Ruger Vaquero. Testing for power factor compliance should always be done with a short-barreled pistol, because that's when velocity will be lowest.

"Power Factor" is (velocity in feet per second x bullet weight in grains/1000. The SASS minimum for smokeless categories is 60, equivalent to 600 feet per second using 100-grain bullets. Minimum velocity is 400 feet per second.

Skinny mentioned that the owner said 2.0 grains of Titegroup exceeded the 60 Power Factor. I don't have any Titegroup. I'm trying to use Shooting

World Clean Shot for everything smokeless. So far it has worked. It is extremely fine grained and thrown charges are quite consistent. I started with 2.0 grains then went up to 2.5, 3.0, 3.6, and 4.0. I used 3.6 instead of 3.5 because that is the

load I use with 105-grain Hi-Tek coated bullets for both revolver and rifle when I shoot in Cattle Baron category.

#### CONCLUSION

The 97-grain bullet is ideal for people who are recoil sensitive or just want NO muzzle flip when dumping 10 rounds as fast as the shooter can shoot. I didn't feel any muzzle flip with any of the loads. I would stay with 3.6 grains. 3.0 would be legal in warm weather, but our experience with it in other loads indicate more powder is needed in cold weather. Yes, 3.3 should work. But muzzle flip is virtually non-existent with 3.6. Spread and Standard Deviation were smaller and smaller as velocity increased, which is to be expected. Normally this means higher accuracy.

I will brave trying the 3.6 load on stages with dump targets at matches this winter.


I also have to mention the Clean Moly. It is, in fact, clean. I try to shoot only coated bullets as part of my lead mitigation efforts. My lead levels have been high in the past. They are acceptable currently. I give credit to the bullets



and using wet tumbling to clean brass.

# DISPATCHES FROM CAMP BAYLOR — EXTRA BRASS CLEANING 2025

hen I started reloading in the 1980s I used the state of the art—a small orange vibratory tumbler with walnut or corncob media, sometimes from pet stores. That got the brass "kinda" clean on the outside. I progressed to the Dillon 500 vibratory cleaner. I still have it, with the 1000 motor, but I haven't used it in a long time.

A few years back my lead levels reached what the chart calls Way Too High. A good part of the lead was coming from the tumbler. Open the lid and the dust was visible. I tried using a particle filter mask, etc., but the shop was coated in lead dust. Then I got a call from the VA telling me my lead level was so high they wanted to know

whom I worked for. OSHA needed to know so they could fine them. I said I worked for Mayor Bloomberg, a well-known anti-gun activist at the time. I had to get to work fixing it. It turned out there were a lot of new products in brass cleaning and safety.

Among other lifestyle changes (Hi-Tek Coated bullets, D-Lead Wipes, Coke Zero instead of Diet Coke, etc.)

I switched to a rotary tumbler and liquid tumbling. The liquid is water with some sort of cleaning and pH adjustment chemicals. Some work better than others. It turned out knowing a few tips and techniques can improve both the shininess of your brass and the lead levels in your blood.

#### **PRETTY BRASS**

In addition to being safer, the brass looks more like new brass. This, of course, makes it shoot more accurately. Well, at least it looks good while I'm missing. It's easier to find, especially in bright sun.

And I know — you're more interested in having your brass wow the peanut gallery than your lead level. Those of you who shoot deliberately dirty brass are wowing people, too.

# THINGS TO LOOK FOR IN ROTARY TUMBLERS

A must have is screw-on caps on both ends with screen and solid

inserts. For rinsing, use the screens at least on the bottom and pour rinse water through. Then put the screen on the other end and run water with that end down. Rinsing "excessively" minimizes tarnishing. Then put in the solid inserts and rinse with distilled

or reverse osmosis water. Drain that and use a media separator from your old dry tumbler or available from several brands. You want one that seals because otherwise you'll spray pins. Then put it in a brass dryer or a meat desiccator. (Some brass dryers are relabeled desiccators.) If buying one get one with a timer. The Lyman one has a timer. I haven't found any others. If you already have one without, use your iPhone timer. Ideally, every hour you rotate the trays so every case gets the same amount of heat. I start at the maximum temperature and lower it every hour to the next setting. I check for moisture under the brass. Sometimes it's hot to touch from the top and still wet on bottom. When I'm convinced it's really dry, I turn it off. If I can, I spray Hornady One Shot lube while the cases are still warm.

#### WHAT KIND OF WATER?

Almost all the magic potions call for distilled water. Hard water leaves the brass water spotted. Home water softeners leave the water salty and the brass tarnishes quickly. But we have a reverse osmosis water softener for our drinking water, which gives results similar to expensive distilled water. Part of the secret of keeping brass shiny in storage is to rinse it thoroughly. You can rinse it with tap water. Running water through the tumbler with a screen over the bottom. Then fill with distilled or reverse osmosis water and rinse again.

#### **POPULAR ADDITIVES**

Recipes vary, as does cleanliness and shininess. Detergents such as Dawn liquid and Armor All Wash and Wax are popular. Both of these are improved by adding a mild acidifier. Lemi-Shine is quite popular. Bulk acetic acid powder works as well or better for less money. Just a little is needed. Somewhere between a smidgen and a pinch.

Lyman Turbo-Sonic Brass Cleaner works well by itself. It doubled (more or less) in retail price during Covid, as did nearly everything else. I used it without additives for several years. Frankford Arsenal sells a similar product for less money, but I haven't tested it.

Brass Juice (TheReloadingStation. com) works very well, about the same cost as Turbo-Sonic. I don't see any

downside to either of these two, other than the cost.

Frankford Arsenal InstaClean Brass Cleaning Packs are about the easiest to use, no measuring. They're compressed "pills" that you just drop in the tumbler on top of the water. They're packaged "24 Count in a Resealable Bag for Con-

venient Reloading Transport and Storage."

(Those of you I gave these packets and asked for a report, I'm glad you're out of the hospital and sorry you misunderstood. You drop the packs in a tumbler, you don't bite off a chaw first.)

If I can't find one of the three above, I consider them pretty interchangeable. There are others. I haven't tested them all. Turbo-Sonic cleaner and Frankford Arsenal InstaClean are available from Amazon, which may be more convenient than driving from gun store to gun store. Ignore that if your gun store is a SASS supporter you visit weekly and always has what you want. Brass Juice is strictly online ordering.

## **ADDITIVES TO THE ADDITIVES**

Strat-O-Sheen Powder Burnishing Compound comes in 5-pound and 25-pound bags. I believe five pounds will outlast me. It's a powder that clumps into rocks that break up easily. I've been experimenting with volume and I'm adding an ounce or two per tank. Your mileage may vary. It does leave the brass shinier and smoother.

# THE MOST IMPORTANT ADDITIVE — STAINLESS STEEL PINS

Many of the commentors in chat groups advocate doing everything except using the pins. It takes extra work to separate them and put them back in the tumbler. They say the brass looks the same-on the outside. My tests got results that equaled pin tumbling for a short tumbling time. But after tumbling three hours the pins were clear winners. Plus, I'm spoiled to having brass I can see into. Frankford Arsenal sells a pick-up magnet

that works very well with pins.

## **HORNADY ONE-SHOT CASE LUBE**

I always use case lube when loading. Originally it was to minimize damage to a torn biceps tendon. It makes loading much easier. This one dries to become a dry lube. It doesn't need to be removed from loaded ammunition. So rather than lubing just before loading, I lube after the brass has been dried then store it in a sealed container until use. It has anti-tarnish properties. In tests it often minimized tarnishing compared to brass without it.

## **STORAGE**


I store in sealed containers. MTM ammo cans work well. Unless I'm loading new brass for major matches I'm usually loading brass that is more than a year old. Tightly sealed plastic storage bags work, too.

## **YOUR DECISION**

How hard you work to get your brass showroom shiny is your decision. But remember, yes, your shooting buddies are silently judging you.







## **CORRECTION**

n page 45 In the October 2024 *Cowboy Chronicle* I wrote an Extra to Dispatches — **Percussion Caps 2024.** 

I wrote, "Before every match clean the nipples. If you don't want to remove them, clean the outside half, then turn them 180° and clean that side. Retighten. (Always use Loctite on the threads.)

It should have read, "Aways use Loctite **ANTI-SEIZE** on the threads."

If you followed instructions and now can't get a nipple out, try this — mount the cylinder so it won't move. I use a mount from Bruce Kingsnake Waugh (Facebook) to fit into the chambers of the gun you're using. [Ted Cash muzzleloading supplies — www.tdcmfg.com/product-page/percussion-cylinder-fixture — also sells one — Editor.] I mount it tightly into a vise and use a SliXwrench from <a href="www.slixprings.com">www.slixprings.com</a>. Cheap ones will break if torqued. Put a lot of downward pressure on the wrench and twist. If necessary, heat the cylinder with a heat gun. Then try turning the nipple.

# CLUBBER WILLIAMS CZAR OF NEW YORK'S TENDERLOIN DISTRICT



lexander S. "Clubber" Williams was a New York City policeman during the late 19th and early 20th centuries. He was tough, intelligent, resourceful and ruthless. Williams' precinct was located in one of the most notorious districts in New York City at the time. He used to say that before he was transferred to that part of New York he used to eat chuck steak, but now he was dining on tenderloin. In this way he coined the term for a locale that was famous for prostitution, illegal gambling, and just about every vice a person could imagine. Eventually the term "Tenderloin District" became a generic reference for the sleazy part of

Williams was born in Nova Scotia in 1839. As a child, he emigrated to the United States and became a ship's carpenter for a firm based in New York. In 1866 he joined the New York Police Department. When he first asked for the job, the New York Police Commissioner turned him down. Williams stormed out of the building, but the commissioner called him back. He was impressed by the young man's pluck and hired him.

He certainly had plenty of pluck. Williams was first assigned to the 47th precinct and later to Broadway, two of the most unsavory parts of New York City in those days. Soon after his transfer he sought out two of the toughest criminals in the neighborhood and picked a fight with them. With his truncheon, he battered both thugs senseless and threw them through the window of a saloon. Soon afterwards he was given the nickname "Clubber." Officer Williams certainly wasn't shy about employing the use of force.

In Clubber's day, a New York City policeman's truncheon, or nightclub, was a fearsome weapon. It was two feet





long and one and three-eighth inches thick. A human skull, ribcage, or collarbone was no match for it. Revolvers weren't issued until 1896. I would imagine anyone stupid enough to kill a policeman back then wasn't long for this world.

During the Gilded Age corruption was commonplace in American national politics and municipal government. It was more the rule than the exception for policemen, especially in the big cities, to take bribes and kickbacks. Clubber Williams was typical of his day. He was paid bribes to look the other way when brothels and illegal gambling halls found themselves under pressure by local reformers. In addition, he took "protection money," which ensured protection from an unannounced police raid. Having a police captain on the payroll made good sense from a business standpoint. Since Clubber's district offered satisfaction for a variety of vices, there were many questionable establishments there. He took money from most of them.

It was also in Clubber's best interests to maintain order in the Tenderloin. Too much violent crime would make people avoid the place altogether. He was a good man to have on your side if trouble broke out.

A rather huge venue for sporting events was located square in the middle of Clubber's domain. In those days, it was called Gillmore's garden, but it has since morphed into what is now known as Madison Square Garden. In March 1879, Gillmore's garden hosted the sporting event of the decade, a six-day pedestrian race called the third Astley Cup. Competitors walked around an arena for six-days straight, and the winner was the first guy to hit 500 miles while walking around the

track. It sounds boring, but huge sums of money were wagered and the top pedestrians of the time were well compensated for their suffering. They surely did suffer; they only got brief breaks to eat and grab whatever sleep could be had. By the end of six days, the men still in the race would be shambling wrecks. The crowd loved it. That's what they were paying to see as much as anything else. It was during the third Astley Cup event that Captain Clubber had his finest hours as a policeman.

Thousands of people lined up to buy tickets to see the start of the race, which was scheduled to begin at 1:00 a.m. on March 10, 1879. There were so many customers that the ticket sellers couldn't keep up and as it got closer to 1:00, the crowd became desperate to get in. Captain Clubber Williams

had been assigned to keep things from getting out of hand. He was a good choice for the job.

At 12:45, Clubber ordered the ticket office to be closed and locked the doors to Gilmore's Garden. When the people outside heard the commotion and cheering as the race began, they broke down the door and streamed into the lobby. Clubber and his men were ready and slammed into the mob with their nightsticks swinging. The next day, the New York Times reported "The sound of the heavy blows [that] rained down upon the defenseless heads and bodies" of anybody within range "was sickening."

The police couldn't fully gain control until about 3:00 a.m. after reinforcements had been sent in. Seventy people were seriously wounded, but

nobody was killed. It could have been a lot worse if order hadn't been restored; the casualties would have been in the hundreds if the riot had been allowed to continue. In the aftermath, nobody sided with the mob. In fact, the police were applauded.

A couple of days into the race the favorite, an American named Dan O'Leary, began to falter. An Englishman named Charles Rowell took the lead. Rowell was in his tent inside the arena when a crowd of drunks began to make threatening noises. Williams was on hand to save the day. He strode into the crowd and began using his night-stick. The crowd backed off but began cursing the police captain. Clubber seems to have picked out a random guy in the crowd to make an example of what happened to folks without proper

respect for the law. The man he chose, a certain William Blake from Trenton, New Jersey, was bludgeoned mercilessly and thrown out of the building. All the witnesses agreed that Blake had done nothing wrong. Afterwards, Blake filed a complaint against the police captain but predictably it didn't really go anywhere. Blake didn't strengthen his case when he was seen sneaking back into Gilmore's Garden the night of his beating.


Yet another incident marred the competition. So many people showed up on the evening of Wednesday, March 12 that Gilmore's Garden was standing room only in a few places. The balconies offered the best view of the arena and so many people crammed into the southwest balcony section that the structure collapsed. Dozens of spectators crashed into the floor. In the chaos that followed, some moron yelled, "fire!" A stampede threatened to develop.


Williams, thinking quickly, sent officers to urge people back to their seats. He was nearly trampled when he put himself between a surging crowd and one of the exits. Once things calmed down, he ordered the orchestra to play some cheerful music. He and the other policemen aided the injured and began cleaning up the mess. Although nine people were seriously injured, nobody was killed. Soon afterward, the race continued. Clubber Williams may have been a brute, but he was professional to the core that night.











Williams remained in charge of the Tenderloin district until 1887, when he was promoted to Inspector. He'd been brought up on charges for using excessive force eighteen times but he managed to evade conviction each time. Clubber had friends in high places, as well as in low places. He was unrepentant about beating the hell out people and once said, "There is more law in the end of a policeman's nightstick than there is in a decision by the Supreme Court." He also professed to have hurt feelings over his nickname, claiming he never pummeled a person who didn't have it coming. If Clubber did indeed have hurt feelings, he cried all the way to the bank with them. He was getting kickbacks and bribes from bookies, brothel owners, illegal gambling houses, and whatever other shady establishments you could imagine. If Williams was forced to conduct a raid during New York City's periodic spasms of reform, his intended targets would get plenty of advance warning. Once the spasm passed, his prices for protection went up.

All good things come to an end. In 1894, Senator Clarence Lexow created an eponymous committee to investigate corruption in the NYPD. The Tenderloin District in general and Inspector Williams in particular became one of the top subjects of the inquiry. A Chief Inspector testified he received regular payments from gambling houses and brothels which he turned over to Williams. Clubber gave a mighty effort, but he couldn't evade this particular spasm. Forced to testify, Williams was asked how he was able to afford several properties, a yacht, and a house in Cos Cobb, Connecticut on a policeman's salary. His answer was he had made shrewd investments in Japanese real estate. Nobody believed him.

The investigation opened a veritable can of worms. It was embarrassing because of the scope of the corruption. Clubber wasn't the only corrupt cop on the NYPD; he was one of many. Besides, even though his methods were sometimes brutal and his extracurricular activities were questionable, Williams did his job very well. Thanks to Clubber, predatory gangs were broken up and the Tenderloin District was a relatively safe place to indulge in your unwholesome passions if it was your choice to do so. New York Police Commissioner Theodore Roosevelt allowed Williams to quietly retire with full pension in 1895.

In the same year of his retirement, Williams attempted to enter New York State politics by making an unsuccessful bid for that state's Senate. Later, he went into the insurance business. It should not come as a surprise that he was successful at it. After all, he had been selling insurance of a sorts to all those brothel keepers and gambling house owners during his thirty years as a policeman. In 1917, he died peacefully at the age of 77.

# MRS. SLICK SHOT AUGUST 26, 1952 – JUNE 21, 2024

🗖 dgewood, NM — A very bright light in SASS has been extinguished. Deborah Baker (Mrs. Slick Shot, SASS #691 Life Regulator), former member of the SASS Board of Directors, lost her courageous battle with cancer on June 21, 2024. She was a pioneer in the early days of Cowboy Action Shooting<sup>™</sup>, even before the establishment of SASS, and she was my very dear friend for nearly four decades, since 1985. She is survived by her husband of 47 years, Wild Shot, (SASS #51 Life Regulator) and her sister Dianne Durant. She is mourned by countless SASS members who were privileged to know her.

In the early 1980s, Mrs. Slick Shot attended the West End Gun Club of San Bernadino, California's first annual match, Showdown, as a spectator. She was impressed by the emphasis on safety, intrigued by the costumes, and amazed by the friendliness of the people. She was hooked and hadn't even fired a shot!

At the very next Cowboy match she arrived early and helped wrangle steel to set up the match stages. Then, with guns, ammo, and leather provided by Tex (SASS #4) she shot her first match. She had been shooting handguns for some time, but this was her very first time shooting a rifle and shotgun. At the end of that match, when the scores were posted, to her surprise, she wasn't last. From the match, she and Wild Shot went straight to the Great Western Gun Show to purchase, guns, gear, and reloading equipment.

Soon, Mrs. Slick Shot began assisting with sign ups and helping to score the monthly matches. Before long, she became co-match director at West End, a position she held for twelve years.

Believing costuming was an important part of the game, she began creating

and sewing her own. She spent hours researching, finding old mail order catalogs, Victorian patterns, and old photos as guides. She encouraged and helped other women make their own outfits, and even made outfits for others, me included.

She won numerous working costume contest awards as well as best dressed costume awards. Eventually, she stopped entering costume contests because, "I've won enough — time to let others win the awards." Years later, at one of the SASS Conventions, she presented several seminars on "How to Make Stunning Costumes Inexpensive-

ly." She also ramrodded Administration at several Conventions.

In the early years, shooting categories were simple — Modern, Traditional, and Ladies. As matches grew and more women began shooting fixed sight revolvers, Mrs. Slick Shot became an advocate for breaking the Ladies Category into Modern and Traditional.

In the beginning, scoring matches was done by hand, with pencil and paper. I vividly remember Mrs. Slick Shot and I scoring a West End Outlaws annual match exactly that old fashioned way while sitting in a shed in 100-degree weather with only a small

fan to cool us! As matches grew larger, a more efficient means of scoring became imperative. Mrs. Slick Shot asked Wild Shot if he could write a simple computer program that would make scoring easier. So Wild Shot wrote a DOS program. (Remember DOS?) Soon, other clubs were inviting Mrs. Slick Shot to score their monthly and annual matches. She continually suggested ways to make inputting scores faster and easier, and Wild Shot, along with Alamo Al, incorporated those changes into the program. The result was Score Card, the first official SASS scoring program.

I only met her a couple of times, but today I shot at The Cowboys and several times as I put my guns back in my cart, I thought of her and how she paved the way for me to be able to enjoy this sport.

For several years, Mrs. Slick Shot and Wild Shot traveled to matches all over Southern California, Arizona, Nevada, Texas, and even New Mexico, helping other clubs get started and helping to organize and score SASS matches. She headed the scoring team at END of TRAIL for more than ten years.

Mrs. Slick Shot became the first lady RO instructor and traveled to New Zealand at the request of the New Zealand Pistol Association to teach RO1, RO2, and RO instructor courses.

She was a serious SASS competitor, often finishing at or near the top of her category, but she always felt it was her obligation to bring many women into the sport, teaching them to shoot, and helping them improve their game. She loved teaching women how to shoot shotgun without it hurting them. She also taught women how to shoot Cowboy Clays.

In 2010, the Wild Bunch tasked Mrs. Slick Shot with determining the feasibility of starting a Sporting Clays range at Founders Ranch. With the Board's approval, she obtained an office building (a small mobile home), a small array of traps, and Founders Ranch Shotgun Sports Club was founded, with her as its director. For several months, she was the course setter, trap loader and mechanic, score keeper, and bookkeeper until Wild Shot joined her.

She was a proud member of the SASS Board of Directors and Founders Ranch. It was my honor to nominate her as a Legendary LOCAS and present her with that prestigious award at END of TRAIL 2021.

Mrs. Slick Shot never sought the limelight. She worked mostly behind the scenes for many decades to promote SASS, help other clubs and other shooters. She was a constant supporter of SASS and the Cowboy Way, quietly influencing improvements in the game and SASS from its very beginning. She is one of the unsung heroines of SASS.

To say she will be missed is a vast understatement. Rest in peace my dear friend.






## **FREEBIRD**

Freebird is survived by his wife Janet, daughters, sons, and grandchildren.





# MOUNTAIN MULE SKINNER OCTOBER 5, 1938 – JUNE 5, 2024

avid Gareth Foulds (Mountain Mule Skinner, SASS #94447) passed away in the early morning hours of June 5 at the Winchester Medical Center in Winchester, VA at the age of 85. Known as Gareth to his vast circle of friends, he had been diagnosed with Legionnaires Disease just a few months after his loving spouse, Gale, died from sudden heart problems. They had planned ahead and donated their physical bodies to West Virginia University medical school.

I consider myself most fortunate to have been part of his extended family during the past two-plus decades. We were both retired military officers and his youngest daughter had married my youngest son (an active-duty USAF captain) in a military wedding ceremony on his property. He introduced me to SASS via loan of a second-hand flea market video cassette about Cowboy Action Shooting™. I was hooked and we decided to join SASS at about the same time. He was an avid gun collector and had created a target area for small arms at the back of his outbuildings in rural Berkeley Springs, WV, where I had a chance to try out and practice with several firearms I bought from him. We shot together with various posses in WV and Maryland, however, a series of recurring health issues




precluded him from participating more than a couple years.

Gareth was born and lived his formative years in Missouri before moving to San Antonio, TX, to attend Trinity University. Between his junior and senior years, he volunteered as part of Operation Crossroads Africa to help build a school in a small coastal village in the West African country of Benin, returning home with an immense love for the continent.

Gareth was commissioned in 1961 as a second lieutenant in the Army and returned to Texas briefly in 1962 to marry his college sweetheart, Gale Moore (Foulds). Shortly thereafter, He was assigned on an unaccompanied tour to the Demilitarized Zone in South Korea. He and Gale were unfortunately separated again during his 1965-66 Vietnam combat tour. The following year, he was accepted into the Army's Foreign Area Specialty Program, which would take him back to his beloved Africa but not before earning his MA degree in African Studies at Ohio University.

The Foulds family (including two young daughters) began their overseas adventures, with Gareth and Gale assigned to work at U.S. embassies in multiple African countries — he as the military attaché, she in various positions with the State Department — spending most of the following 18 years in Zaire, Cote d'Ivoire, Algeria, Tunisia, Sudan, and Chad. He retired as a colonel in the U.S. Army in 1991 after 30 years of active-duty service and having received numerous U.S. and foreign military medals and decorations. In 1992 he was inducted into the Defense Intelligence Agency's "Attaché Hall of Fame." He then accepted an opportunity to join the CIA and was immensely proud to be awarded the National Intelligence Distinguished Service Medal.

In the same year, he and Gale purchased a barn in Berkeley Springs, WV, which they used as a weekend place. After three years in Ethiopia and Gale's final assignment in Washington, DC, they moved from Capitol Hill and relocated to their renovated barn home in Morgan County. They became an indelible part of Berkeley Springs, joining several envi-



ronmental initiatives including the Sleepy Creek Watershed Association. They were proud to have one of the first residences in Morgan County to be solar-powered. He was a staunch advocate for establishment of the Vietnam War Memorial adjacent to the Morgan County Courthouse and he also purchased several commercial buildings and refurbished them to further preserve and enrich the town.

Mountain Mule Skinner leaves behind two lovely daughters and five grandchildren. His passing created a great void in our hearts. He was not only a "family" member, but my close friend, mentor, fellow shootist, and a patriot I looked up to without question. Overall, he was a unique individual who will be deeply missed. *Adios, compadre!* 

## **RESTLESS**



ne of the most well-known and beloved SASS members in the



several years.




most notably Cowboy Action Shooting $^{TM}$ .



# SUBMISSION GUIDELINES

The Cowboy Chronicle welcomes and encourages submissions of articles and match reports from any and all readers.

Please submit articles in MS Word or something compatible. Open Office and Apple Pages (saved as MS Word) are also fine. A count of 500-800 words is a good target to shoot for, but shorter pieces are also fine. Match reports on larger events, like END of TRAIL, Winter Range, and Regional and Divisional matches may run 1000-1500 words if necessary. We will accept lengthier articles, but may choose to break them up into two or more parts to run in consecutive issues, or heavily edit them.

Please do not embed your photos in the Word document. They can be extracted for use in the *The Cowboy Chronicle*, but it can be a chore to do that. Instead, send your photos separately, in one or more emails, as attachments. Three to six photos per email usually works best. It's best to send JPEGs, but other formats are acceptable, and it's best to keep them at about 300 dpi and 3000 pixels (10 inches) on the short side. That size is

ideal and will allow us plenty of leeway when it comes to cropping and adjusting them for publication. Photos should be at least 1000 pixels on the short side to be used for publication. If you're unsure of the size of your pictures, or how to size them, send what you have and we'll adjust them and/or inform you if they're usable.

Usually, two to six photos are sufficient for an article, but we will consider using more for a "big" event, if provided. Photos need not have captions, but captions always make photos more interesting. Ideally, the caption would consist of one or two sentences that say something about the picture that is not obvious and/or is not implicit in the body of the article. "Sam making smoke" is a title but not a caption. "Sam, SASS #XXXXX, shooting his first black powder match; after much deliberation, he decided to give it a try and now he's hooked" is much better. A caption may also serve to let everyone know why the picture is worthy of being published in an international magazine.
